

# Duxbury man killed in weekend accident in Kingston

## Three others hospitalized after one-car crash

A 23-year-old Duxbury man was killed in an early morning car crash in Kingston on Sunday Feb. 5.

The Plymouth District Attorney's office has identified the victim as Brendan Keohan. He was a passenger in a Jeep that veered off of Winthrop Street in Kingston and crashed into the woods shortly after 1 a.m. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

There were three other people in the car, two men and a woman. The male driver and female passenger were transported to South Shore Hospital. The other man was taken by Med-flight helicopter to Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston.

Duxbury emergency crews responded to the accident along with the Kingston, Pembroke and Plymouth Fire Departments.

"When we got there the car was on its side in the woods," said Duxbury Deputy Chief Christopher West. "Two people were trapped in the vehicle and two people were out of the vehicle. Kingston fire was in the process of extricating one of the trapped occupants."

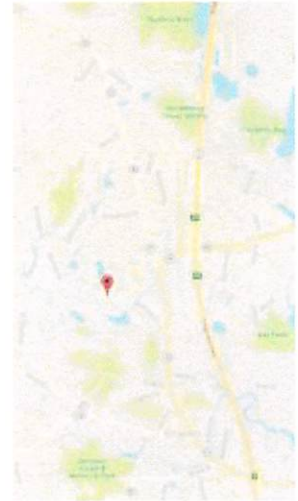
All the people involved in the crash were from Duxbury, said West. Their names have not been released by authorities. There was no word yet on their condition.

Keohan was a 2012 graduate of Duxbury High School.

West said Winthrop Street is a "pretty windy road." It runs from Summer Street in Kingston to streets that connect to Winter Street in Duxbury. The road was closed to traffic for several hours on Sunday.

"It's a tragedy," said West. "These car accidents are tough. My heart goes out to the families."

The cause of the crash is under investigation by the Kingston Police Department and the Massachusetts State Police.
