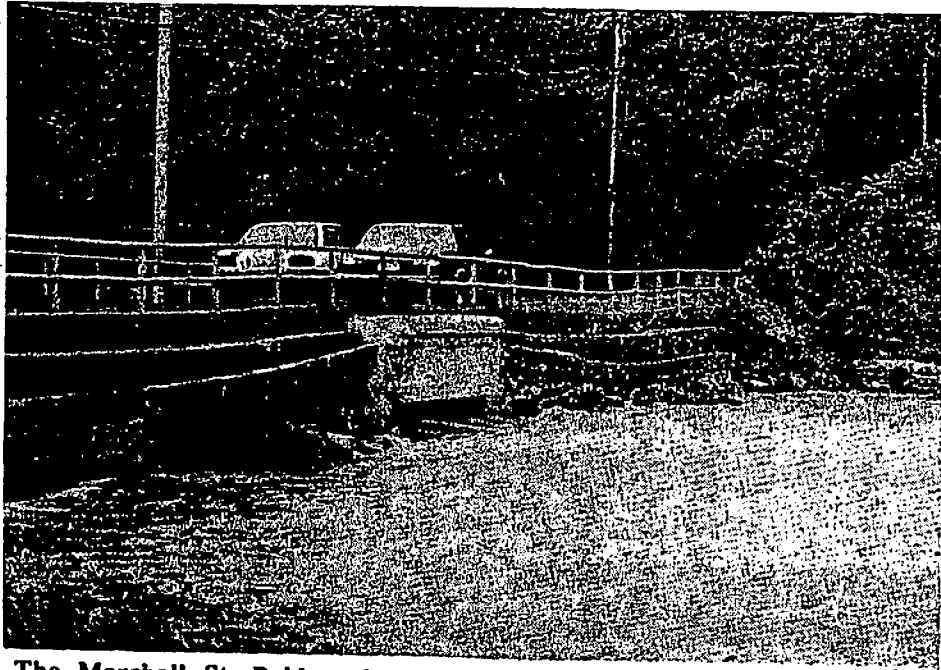
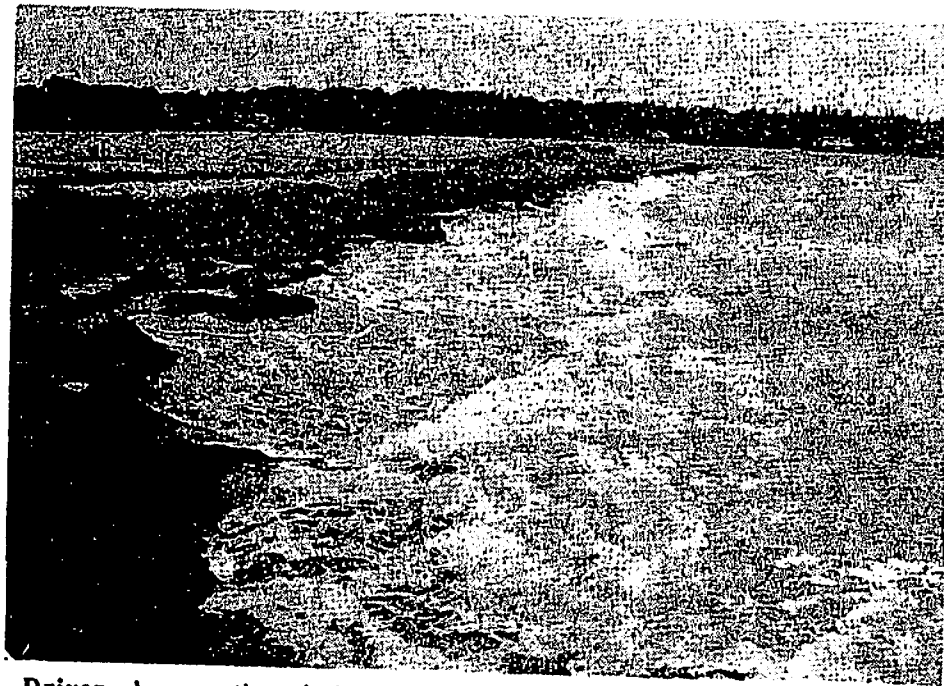


## **"Edouard" Spares Duxbury Major Damage**

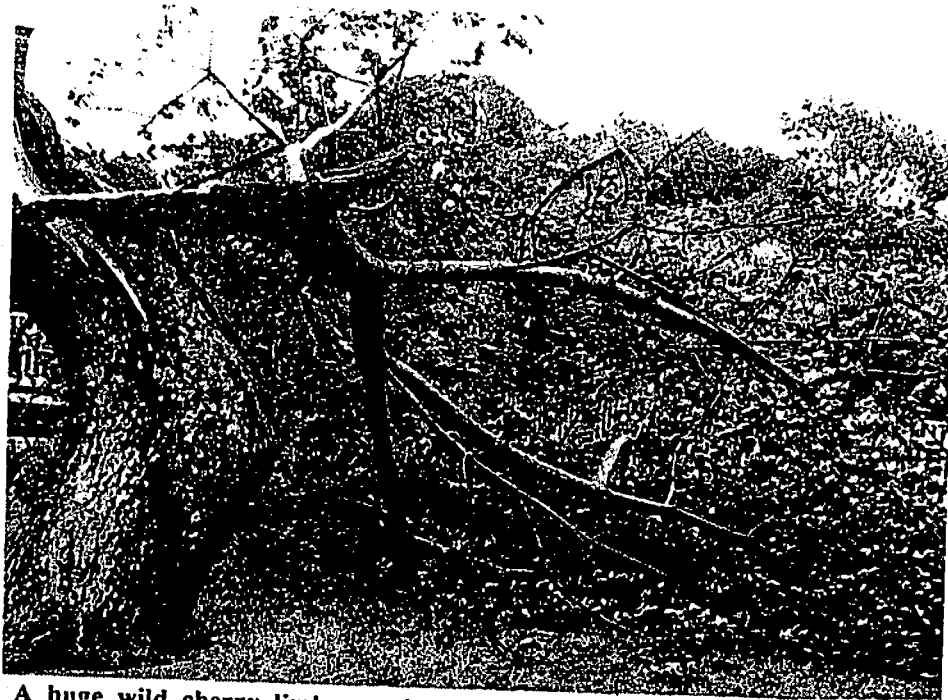

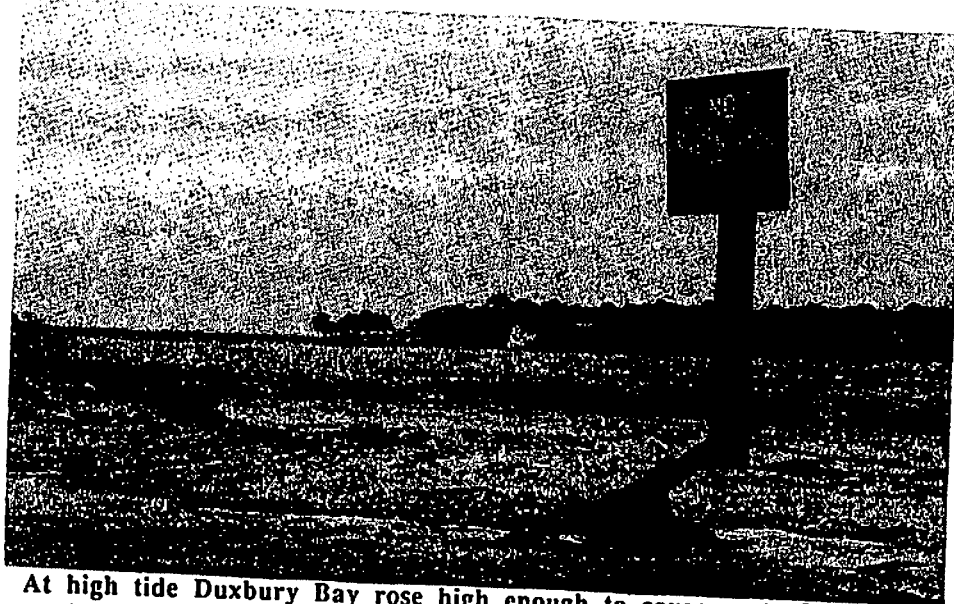
