answered Lexington Alarm)

Col. Gamaliel Bradford = Sarah Alden (grt. gr. dau. of John & Priscilla)  
(Commander of Mass. Regiment in Continental Army  
at Valley Forge)

Capt. Daniel (who built  
on Harrison St., then  
moved to Keene, N.H.)  
(1771-1838)

Jerusha  
(who married Ezra  
Weston)  
1770-1833

Capt. Gamaliel Bradford = Elizabeth Hickling<sup>b</sup>  
(built yellow house across the street)  
(1763-1824)

Capt. Gershom = Sarah Hickling<sup>b</sup>  
(1774-1844) (1772-1861)

Maria = Rev. Claudius Bradford (a 3rd cou.)  
(1804-1863) (staunch abolitionists, lived in Ohio)

Elizabeth<sup>a</sup>  
(Botanist) (1809-1890)

Lucia<sup>a</sup>  
(Literary) (1807-1893)

Charlotte<sup>a</sup>  
(Civil War Nurse at 51,  
on medical ship)  
(1813-1893)

Lucia = Rev. F.N. Knapp  
(1834-1924)

"Uncle" Gershom = Minnie Winsor  
(sailor & marine engineer  
aboard survey ships; Minnie  
spent many years at sea)  
(1838-1918)

Laurence = Hattie Phipps  
(Sailor; Navy officer in  
Civil War; Civil Engineer;  
(1842-1909) (1854-1931)

Louisa F.B. Knapp = Fanny Hall Sarah Maria  
(graduated from Harvard  
and was Prof. of Powder  
Point School)

Gershom = Mary Lightfoot  
(Washington, D.C.)  
(1879-1978)  
No Children

Edward  
(unmarried  
lawyer)  
(1885-1974)

a - These three maiden ladies were known as the "Aunts" in Duxbury

b - Sisters; their brother, Wm. Hickling married one of their husbands' sisters; & went into partnership with Capt. Gam.; their mother, Elizabeth Hodson Hickling as a widow came to live with Sarah & Capt. Gershom - died in 1827
