Chamberlain Photographs On Exhibition At Library

DUXBURY — The photographs and etchings of Samuel Chamberlain, who has been called the "photographer laureate of New England," are on display at the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library.

The photographs and etchings will be on display through Oct. 23. The Library is open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays.

Mr. Chamberlain was born in Cresco, Iowa and settled in Marblehead, Mass. during the 1930's. Since then he has concentrated largely on the New England scene in his etchings and photographs, many of them reproduced in books recording the scenic and historic American countryside.

He combines talent as an etcher and photographer with the architectural training he received at M I T, and many of his most successful books have featured the collected photographs of lovely old homes.

The Chamberlain exhibition, borrowed from the Boston Public Library's Print Department, was selected and arranged by Miss Gay Youse, who plans the Gallery exhibitions for the Duxbury Free Library.
