

Saguisht

In the earliest records of the Plymouth Colony, the point of land now known as Saguisht is called "Sagaquas."

First mentioned in deed of the marsh meadow; namely, all the marsh or meadow that is on the island or spot of land commonly called and known by the name of "Sagaquas."

Heirs of Ephraim Morton (Timothy,
J Josiah, Nathaniel, and Samuel Morton)
sold to Elisha Doten 1725

Elisha Doten sold to Robert Bartlett 1725
3/4 of upland with house, barn,
and fences

Robert Bartlett to Benjamin Hanks 1756
"3/4 of the upland and beach
of the island of Saguisht"

lying and being between
the harbor of Plymouth
with houses, barn, and
fences on said island;
also two pieces of salt marsh
on meadow to said Island.

Benjamin Hanks to Lazarus Le Baron-1746

"All the upland and beach, and
meadow and sedge flat and shore
to low water mark."

Benjamin Hanks was great
grandfather to Abraham Lincoln.

Saquish

7/8 of upland with house, barn, and fences

Robert Bartlett to Benjamin Hanks - 1742

"7/8 of the upland and beach of the island of Saquish lying and being between the harbor of Plymouth with houses, barn, and fences on said island' also two pieces of salt marsh on meadow to said island.

Benjamin Hanks to Lazarus LeBaron - 1746

"All the upland and beach, and meadow and sedge flat and shore to low water mark."

Benjamin Hanks was great grandfather to Abraham Lincoln.
