

Duxbury Grad Wins Emmy Award

Jordan Montminy holds the national Emmy Award he won last week for outstanding achievement in editing *Between the Lions*, PBS.

Last week the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences awarded Jordan Montminy (DHS 1993) a national Emmy for outstanding achievement in editing *Between the Lions*, PBS. Jordan's achievement was celebrated by colleagues in the industry and his parents, Robert and Judith Montminy of Careswell St., at the 28th Annual Daytime Emmy Awards creative craft event held in the Broadway Ballroom of the Marriott Marquis Hotel in New York City.



Jordan's Emmy Award is the latest honor in a string of art awards that began while he was a student in Duxbury. During his senior year at DHS, Jordan received recognition from the Massachusetts School Library Association for his film *The Nightmare* and the Duxbury Art Association awarded him a scholarship to study film at New York

University Tisch School of the Arts. At NYU, Jordan's projects routinely were selected for year-end festivals at the school and appeared in festivals throughout the country, including Beverly Hills, New Orleans, San Francisco, and Anchorage, Alaska. For his senior thesis film *Ghost Toilet!*, Jordan was awarded the first Russell Hexter Filmmaker Grant at NYU. *Ghost Toilet!* Was included in a comedy festival of short films at Caroline's Comedy Club in New York and recently was named "most watched on-line short film" by iFilm.com.

Since graduating from NYU in 1997, Jordan has been working as an editor and producer. In addition to *Between the Lions*, his credits include *Trauma: Life in the ER* on the Learning Channel and hour-long documentaries — *South Beach* on the Travel Channel and the pilot for Lifetime's *Women Docs*.
