ETCHINGS AT GALLERY

The lithograph-etchings of Richard Claude Ziemann are being exhibited in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library from Jan. 14 to Feb. 15. The works in the current show are landscapes and have been loaned through the courtesy of the Alpha Gallery of Newbury St.

Ziemann, who was born in Buffalo, N.Y. attended Albright Art School and Yale University Summer School of Art and he holds a B.F.A. and an M.F.A. from Yale University.

He has taught art at Yale and is presently an assistant professor of art at Hunter College. He headed the Graphic Arts Workshop exhibit which toured the Soviet Union in 1963 and 64.

He has received grants from the Buffalo Foundation, a Fullbright grant to the Netherlands, the Tiffany Foundation and the National Institute of Arts and Letters.

His impressive list of prizes include two from the Audubon Artists and his prints are in the collections of museums and galleries throughout the country.

B.U. Professor Exhibits Art

DUXBURY — Jack Kramer, professor of art at Boston University's School of Fine and Applied Art, met the public yesterday afternoon at the opening of his exhibition of drawings and paintings in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library.

The exhibition will continue through May 4. Gallery hours are from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, and 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday.

The exhibition is being held in conjunction with the publication of his new book — "Human Anatomy & Figure Drawing".

ART EXHIBIT AT LIBRARY

The four museum graduates exhibition now being shown in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library is featuring the Art Advisory Committee, which has assisted the library in the operation of the gallery, and Gay Youse, who has served as its exhibitions director since the gallery's opening in 1969.

The Art Advisory Committee is composed of seven members appointed by the Board of Library Trustees for three-year terms, with no member to serve more than two full terms. The committee is responsible to the trustees for recommending policy for the gallery, and its members make suggestions and review the proposed schedule of gallery shows. Miss Youse is in charge of planning, selecting and hanging exhibitions.

The three committee members

whose work is being exhibited -- Marjorie Bush-Brown, Leo Prince, and Frank Rogers--are artists and graduates of the Museum of Fine Arts School. Richard Hasty, the committee chairman, is the official representative of the trustees. The other committee members, selected for their demonstrated appreciation of the arts, are Patrick Dudensing, Jessie Petcoff and Priscilla Sangster.

The Helen Bumpus Gallery, a gift to the town from Mrs. H.C. Bumpus, Jr., has been operative for the past three years through private donations. At the 1972 Town Meeting the trustees of the Duxbury Free Library will ask in Article 55 that the regular funding of the gallery be appropriated because it is their conviction that the gallery has proven itself a legitimate and worthwhile part of the library program.
