SCULPTURE EXHIBIT

A one-man exhibition of the sculpture and drawings of Lloyd Lillie will open in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library on Sunday, Nov. 5. The public is invited to meet the artist from 4 to 6.

Lillie, a resident of Newton, is an Associate Professor of Art at Boston University. He has studied at the Corcoran Museum School, and the Accademia di Belle Arti, in Florence, Italy.

His most recent exhibitions have been at Colby College, Maine, and the Sculptors' Guild of New York. Some of his work is now being shown as part of the Faculty Exhibit at Boston University.

The exhibition will include casts of the portraits of Andrew Carnegie and Joseph Pulitzer which he created on School of Art, Washington, D. C., Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculptures, Boston Museum of Immigration at the Statue of Liberty.

The exhibition, scheduled from Nov. 5 through Dec. 6, has been selected and arranged by Library Art Director, Gay Youse. Gallery hours are: Weekdays, 10-9; Saturday, 10-6; and Sundays, 2-5.

Art Exhibition To Be Opened Sunday Afternoon
