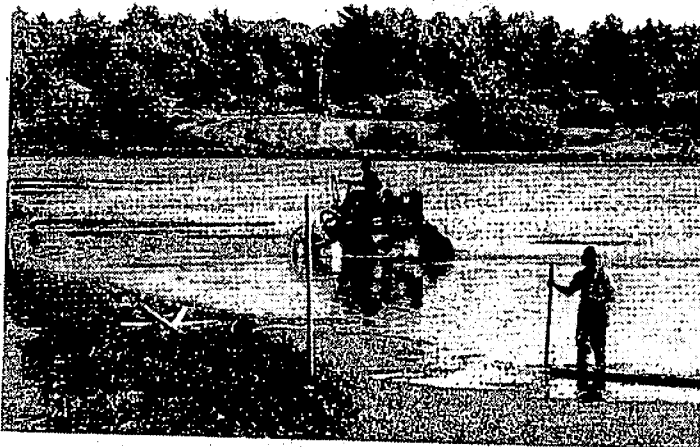

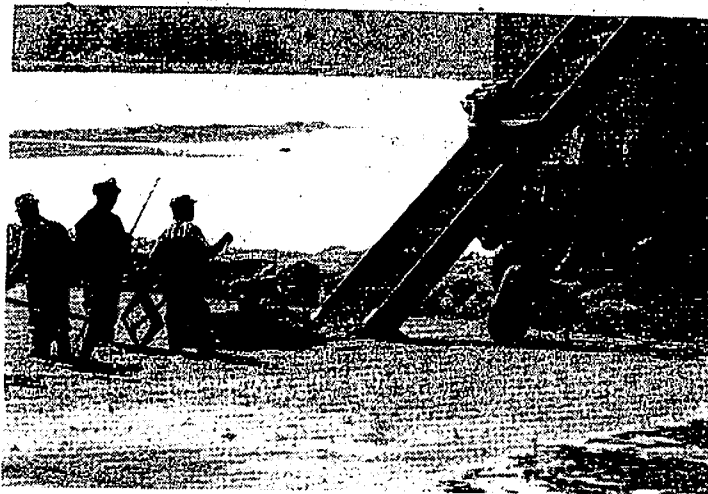

## HARVEST CRANBERRIES NEW WAY



The gasoline-powered water reel is the latest innovation introduced by cranberry companies to harvest their crop in Plymouth County. The tractor-like water reel shown here is used to cut the cranberries from the vine after the bog has been flooded. The berries then float to the surface and are gathered by cranberry pickers.



Here workers from the United Cape Cod Cranberry Co. gather the berries into a chute which carries them to a storage box. They will be shipped to the company's plant in Middleboro to be processed. The water reel method of harvesting the crop is more efficient and less expensive than older harvesting methods.
