Bay Players Who Appeared In "The Happy Time" At DHS on Apr. 20

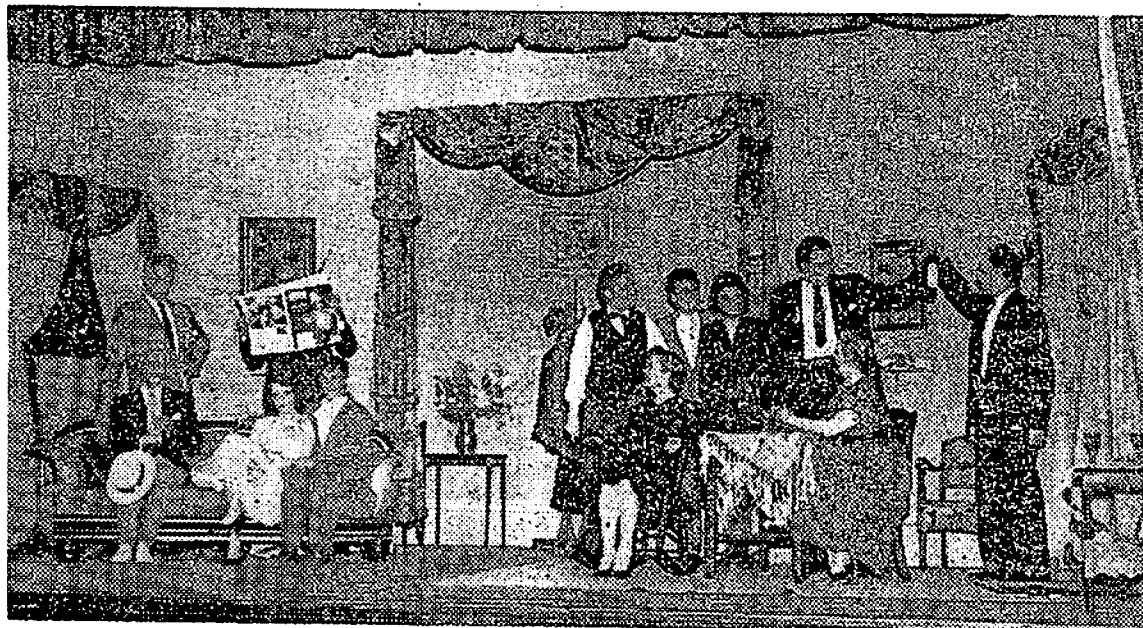
