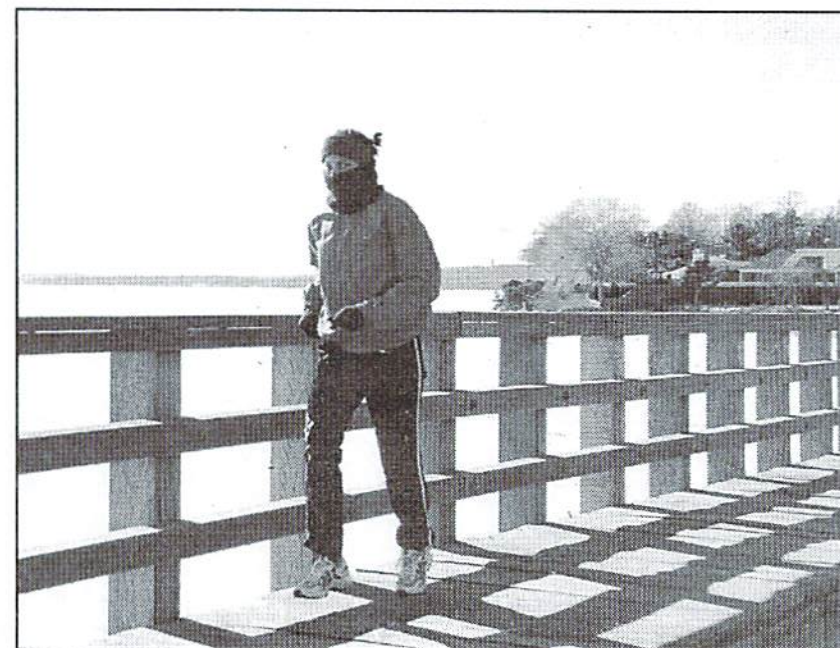
Pigeons sun themselves on the roof of the DYC waterfront hut, protected from a north-west wind.



The sunshine makes for a dazzling view on a Bay Road marsh.



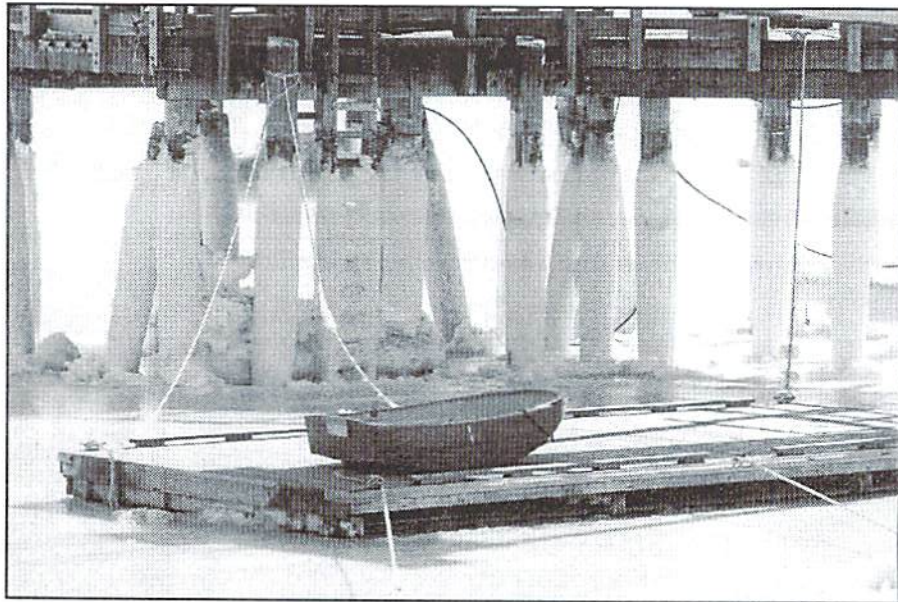
The sunshine couldn't melt the ice that coated the bay as the long stretch of freezing weather continued.



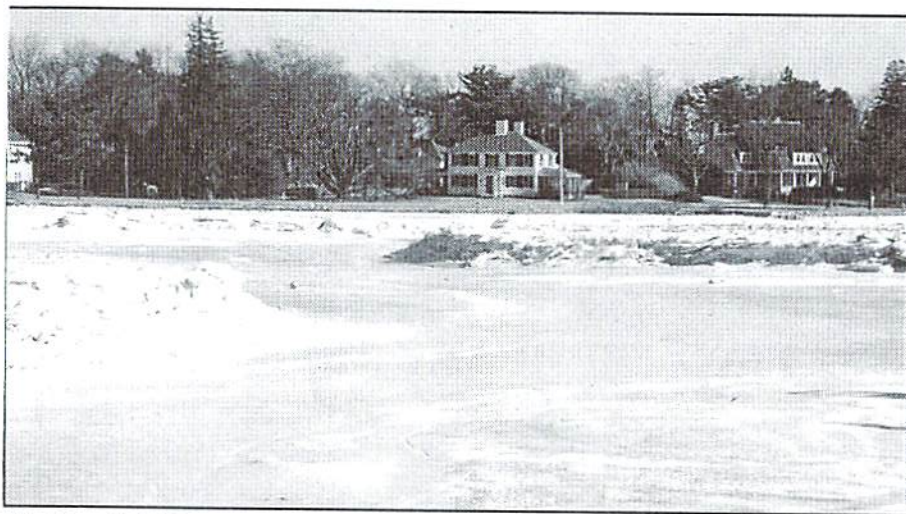
A bundled up jogger braved the freezing air on Powder Point Bridge.
