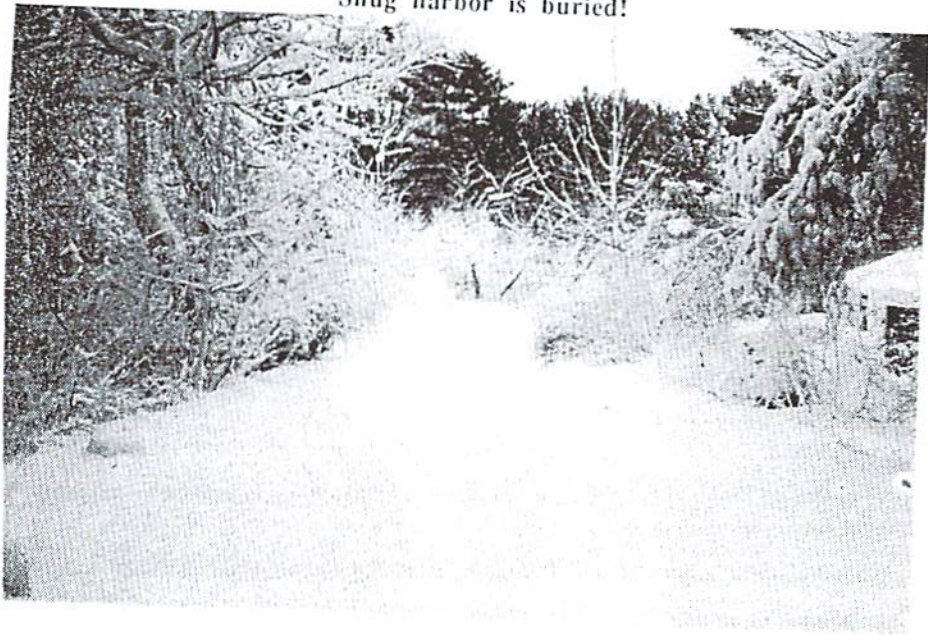

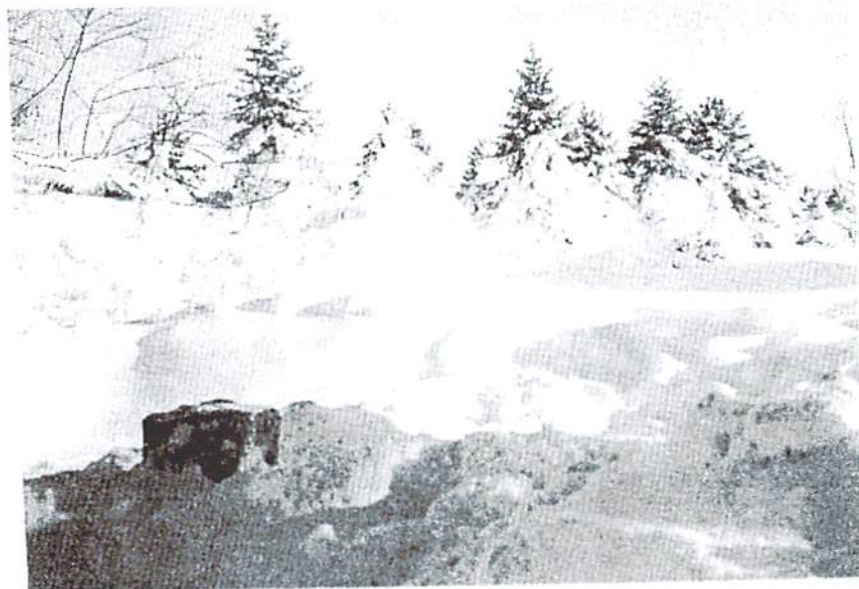

Snow covered trees frame a quiet winter lane.



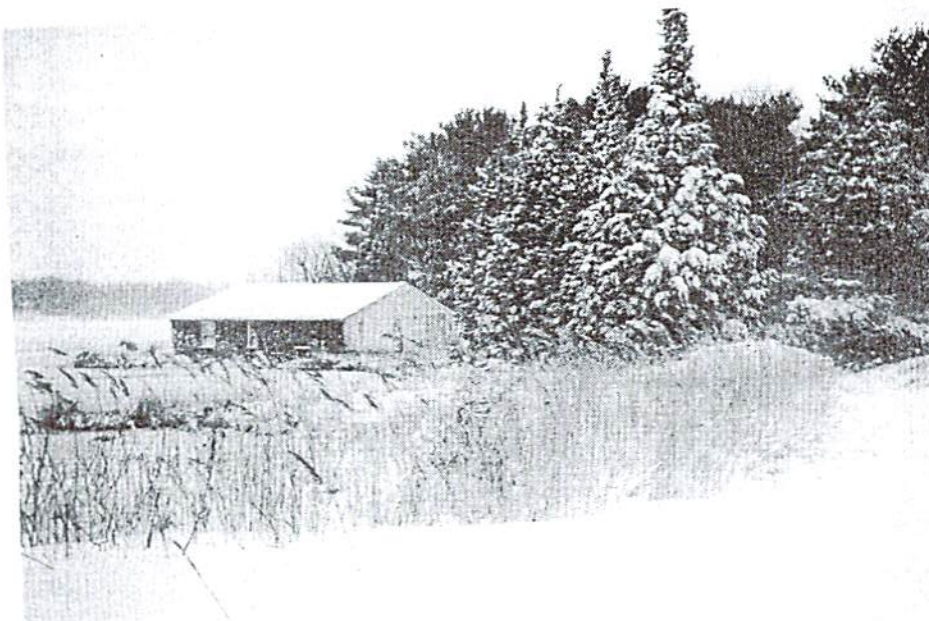

Christmas trees are iced with snow.



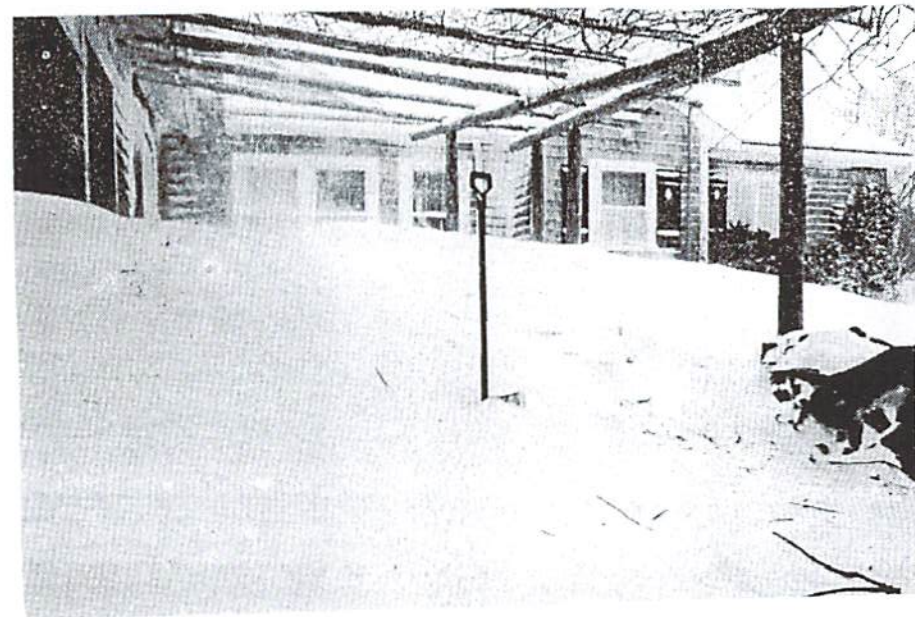
Peter Wiemeyer finds a way to get around on his cross-country skis.



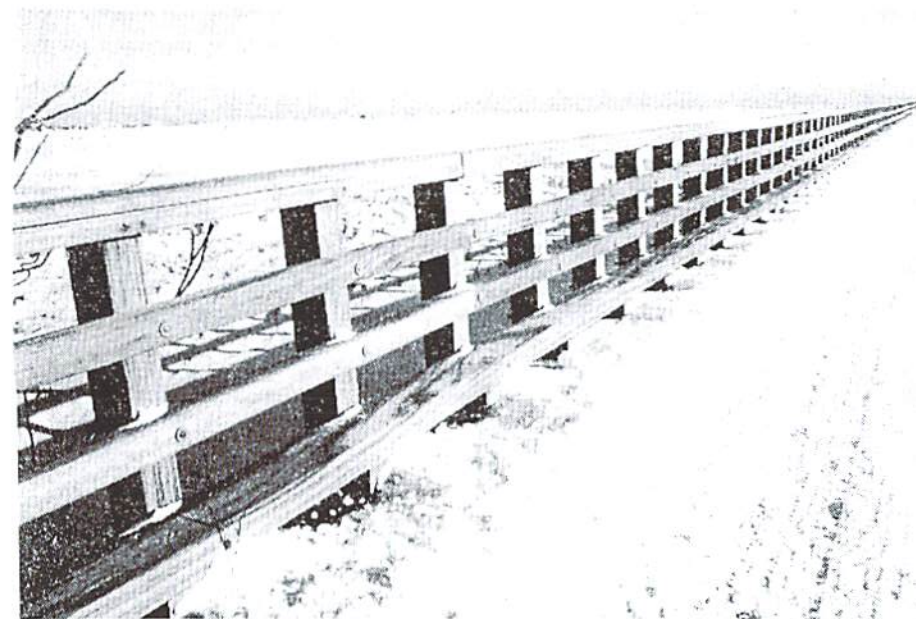
Eagles Nest Cove is covered with snow.



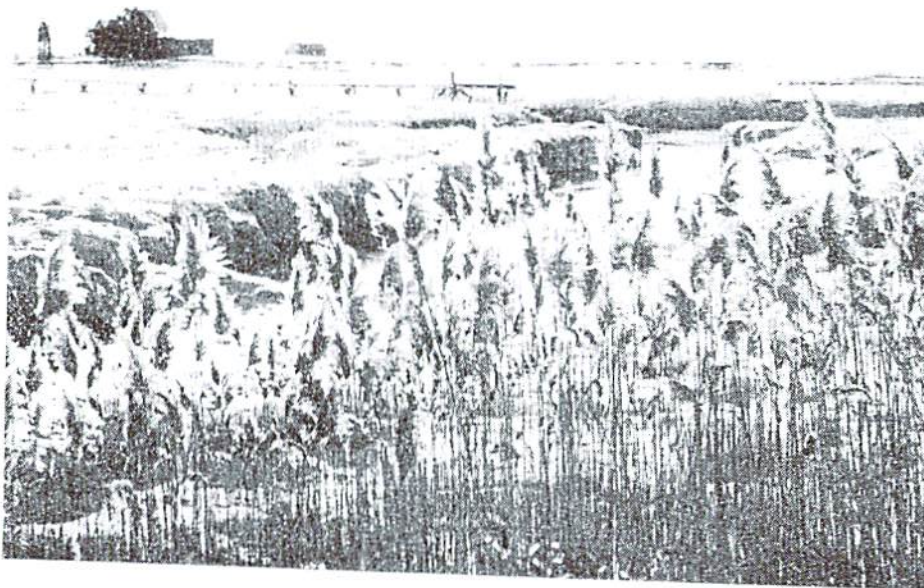
