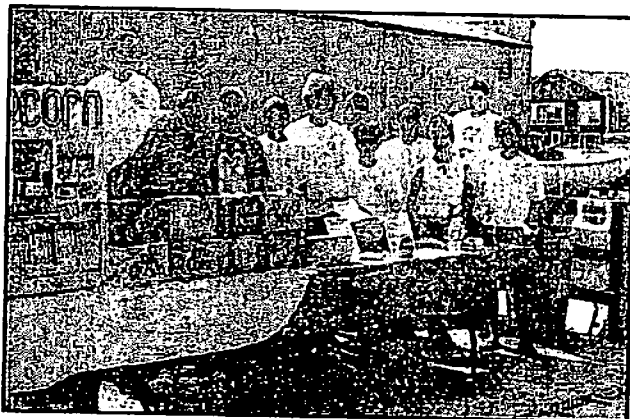


Classic Boat Show -Part of Classic Boat Weekend

Sponsored by the Duxbury Bay Maritime School, Duxbury Yacht Club, Snug Harbor Boat Works, and the DR&HS



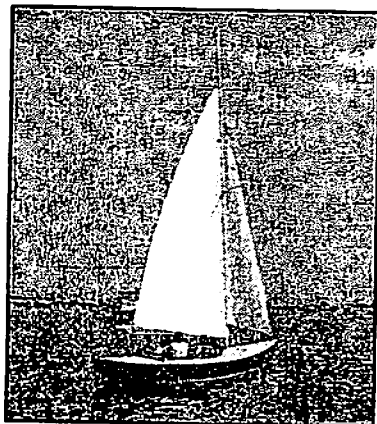
The DHS Sailing Team sold refreshments.



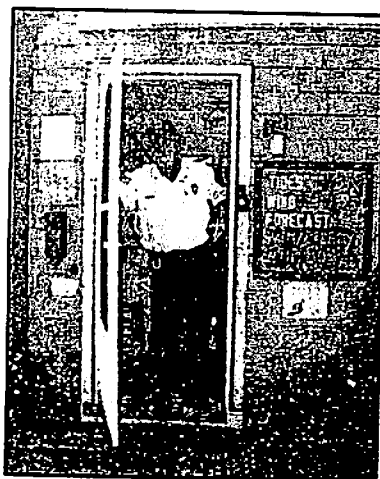

Jeff Goddstein and Todd Merritt were two of the musicians who played at the boat show.



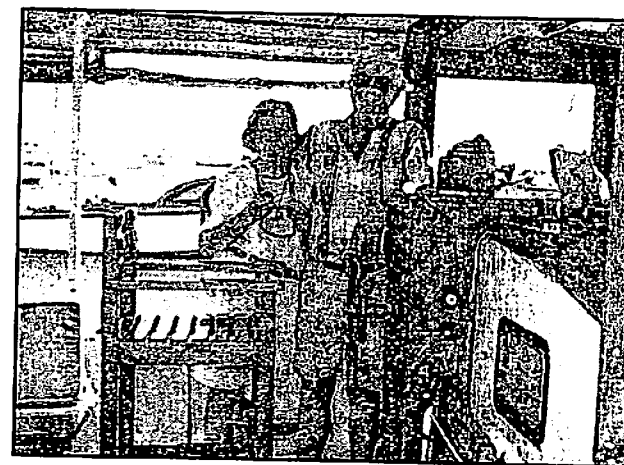
John Daily from Snug Harbot Yachts and Boatworks gave rides on a Pin-tail 25' sailboat to all who were interested.



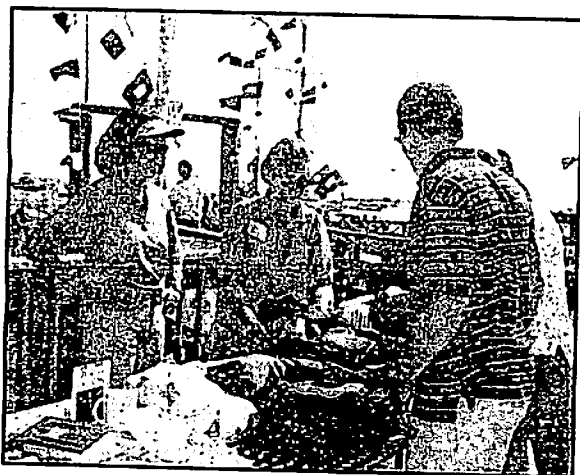
Harbor Master Don Beers welcomed all the visitors.



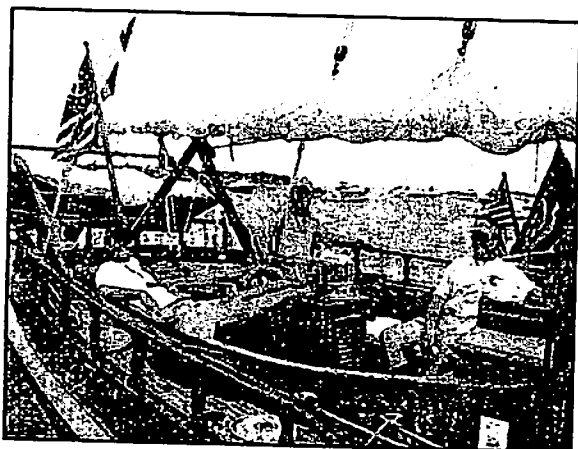
Long time yachtsman Allan Eaton enjoys a bowl of "chowda."

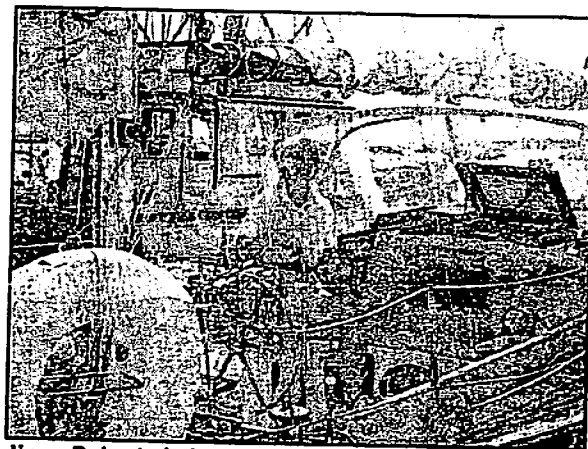

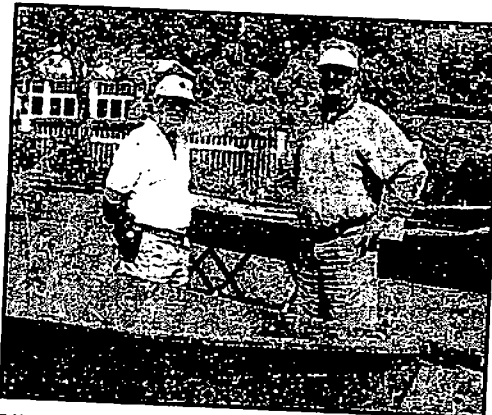
Jinny Doherty is happy to spend the day on her son's boat, *Bellatrix*, a 41' Rhodes Reliant.



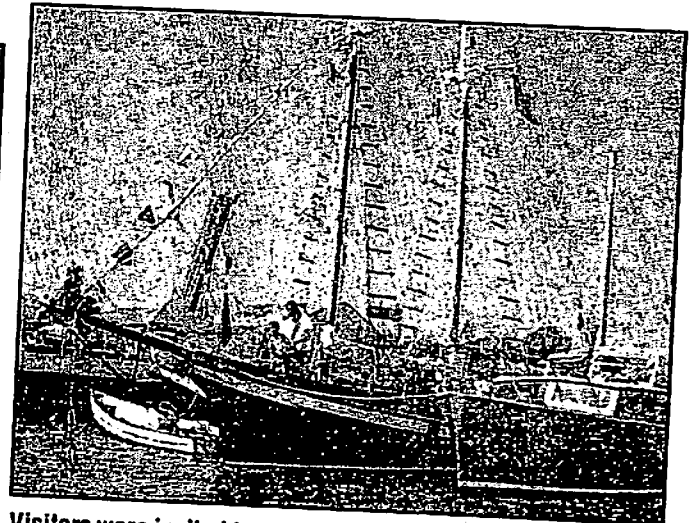
