

Project Bug Light Incorporated

As of July 28, the Massachusetts Secretary of State authorized the Project Bug Light group to become a non-profit organization.

The sole aim of the organization is to save Duxbury Pier Light (as it is officially known) from the Coast Guard's original plan of cutting the lighthouse in half and leaving the bottom half of the structure as a support base. On that base was to be mounted a plastic, tubular structure with a new beacon light, the same size as the present one, and a new fog horn.

Instead of this, however, the organization wished to restore, rebuild and preserve the present old landmark. In doing so, the group will probably cut tax-

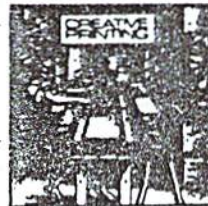
