## RECEPTION FOR COMPANY I

Henry Maglathlin of Duxbury was captain of Company I in the Fourth Massachusetts Regiment which served in the Civil War in 1862-3.

He was the son of Bartlett Maglathlin, grandson of John, from Glasgow, Scotland. His mother was Maria W., daughter of the late Deacon Nathan

Chandler of Kingston.

Here is an account of the reception given Company I:

### Reception Home

Agreeable to arrangements made by a citizen committee of Duxbury, the Company, on their return from the seat of war, had a cordial reception, August 22, 1863, at 2 o'clock p.m., on the

grounds adjacent to the Town Hall in Duxbury.

The company formed on the grounds on the south side of the Unitarian Church, at 1½ o'clock p.m., and marched from thence, under the direction of the Chief Marshal, William J. Alden, Esq., escorted by the committee of arrangements, to the ground in front of the stand appropriated for their accomodation. At the stand the exercises were: a fervent prayer, by Rev. A. Josselyn; a patriotic address of welcome, by Hon. G. B. Weston; a presentation of flags, on which were inscribed "Bisland," and "Port Hudson;" a pertinent reply, by Capt. Maglathlin, and a song of welcome, by misses.

At the conclusion of the out-door ceremonies, a procession was formed in the following order: - citizens, four abreast; gentlemen of the committee of arrangements; ladies of the committee of arrangements, and the singing misses, and presentation misses, and Company I; and the Company escorted to an elegant collation in the Town Hall. At the table several patriotic toasts were given, and speeches

made by Hon. G. B. Weston, Capt. Maglathlin, and by Sergeants Kaspar and Lane.

The committee of arrangements consisted of gentlemen, G. B. Weston, S. N. Gifford, Peleg Cook, Nathaniel Ellis, and Philip

Chandler, Esqs.; and ladies, Mrs. William T. Swift, Mrs. G. B. Weston, Mrs. Andrew Northey, Mrs. John M. Winsor, Miss Lizzie L. Sampson, and Mrs. Le Baron Goodwin.
