# Scoops under new ownership

On Friday, Scoops ice

cream shop opens for the sea-  
son, and this year, it will be

under new ownership.

Lisa Grace of Cove Street

bought Scoops last October.

On Monday, the Board of Se-

lectmen voted unanimously

to grant her a common vic-

ice cream shop located at 13

Standish Street in Hall's Cor-

ner.

"I am excited about be-

coming a new small business

owner in town and look for-

ward to continuing to provide  
great ice cream to the commu-  
nity," Grace wrote in a letter to  
selection.

Grace plans to manage the

business with the help of her

family, employing her two

teenaged children as well as

other summer workers. Her

daughter Emily worked at

Scoops last summer.

"I always thought it would

be fun to have a small business

in town," said Grace. "We're

just so excited to take it over."

Scoops will be open daily

from 1 to 9 p.m. from mid

April until Columbus Day in

October. It offers ice cream,  
trappes, freezes, and ice cream  
sundaes.

Grace, who has lived in

Duxbury for the past 13 years,

was a business major in col-

lege and had a career in sales

before raising a family. As a

teenager, she had a window

washing business.

Scoops won't be chang-

ing much inside or out, said

Grace.

"We'll keep most things

the same," she said. "People

like things the same and have

certain expectations for their

ice cream shop."

The biggest change Grace

has planned right now is to of-

fer hot caramel in addition to

hot fudge. Ice cream cookie

sandwiches will also be on the

menu at some point, she said.

Local high school teacher

Mark Dunn opened Scoops 23

year ago and ran it for 16 years.

He sold it in 2009 to Richard

Michelson of Franklin Street

and it changed hands again in

2012, when Susan Horton of

Anchorage Lane purchased

the business.
