

Streets Signs Revamped

The next time you turn onto your street you may notice a slight change.

The size and design of the town's street signs are being revamped. DPW Director Tom Daley said Duxbury's white street signs with black lettering will soon be replaced by green signs with white lettering. Daley said the change comes at the request of the federal gov-

ernment to create bigger signage.

The size of the letters will change from four to six inches causing the size of the sign to increase as well. The color will be changed to green because that is the color synonymous with information, Daley said. The town's seal, stating its incorporation in 1637, is another new feature of the sign.

Harrison Street and Lovers Lane signs have already undergone the change. Daley said the rest of the town's signage will be switched over in the next few years to meet the federal government's 2011 deadline.

"As we're paving the roads, we're switching the signs," Daley said.
