## Steal three paintings in Dux. show

Three paintings from the Leo Prince Exhibition at the Duxbury Free Library were stolen from the Helen Bumpus Gallery. The robbery still under investigation, took place between the time the library closed Thursday evening, Sept. 25 at 8 and Friday morning at 9 when the gallery was opened for cleaning.

The paintings, all abstracts, were taken out of their frames and off the wood stretchers. Mr. Prince set the value of the three pieces at \$1,100. He is preparing sketches of the paintings, and these will be widely circulated.

The trustees of the library, the Art Advisory Committee and the artist are all anxious to recover the paintings and will accept their return with no questions asked. They would greatly appreciate any information that might lead to recovery.

Mr. Prince, a freelance artist who lives in Duxbury and teaches at the Museum of Fine Arts School in Boston, has been exhibiting his paintings in the Helen Bumpus Gallery in a one-man show running through Oct. 17.

## Photos, Sculpture Shown at Library

DUXBURY — The photography of Daniel Bernstein and the sculpture of Jean and Frank Tock will be featured in an exhibition in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library Nov. 2 through 29. The public is invited to meet the artists at the opening Sunday, Nov. 2 from 4 to 6.

Daniel Bernstein, a resident of Pembroke, is a professional photographer who has done assignments for Life, Look, Saturday Evening Post, Time Newsweek, and others including publications in France, Italy, Germany and South America.

Frank Tock, an expressionistic sculptor who works in bronze as well as with new media, will be represented in the Helen Bumpus Gallery Exhibition by five of his sculptures. Three of the sculptures of Jean, Tock will be shown. Mrs. Tock, whose work has been widely shown, has done several notable sculptures for architecture in the area. The Tocks are residents of Duxbury and Boston.
