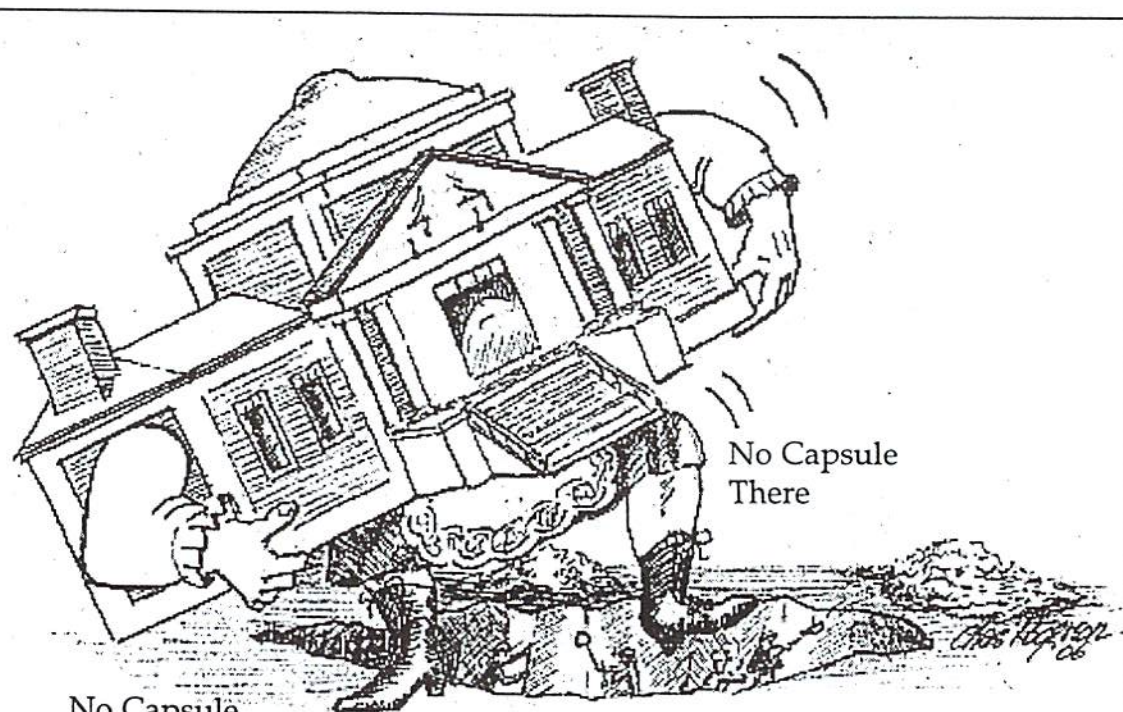
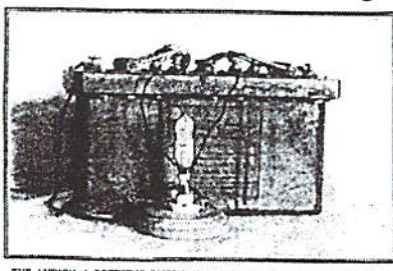

But times weren't simpler after all: In the October of 1907, Knickerbocker Trust and the Westinghouse Electric Company both failed, and touched off the Panic of 1907.

Here in Duxbury, according to *The American Monthly Review of Reviews*, wireless telephony was carried on from a tall mast at Brant Rock, across Duxbury Bay to Plymouth, a distance of about twelve miles 1907. Today, wireless means you PDA. There have
