## Top of their games

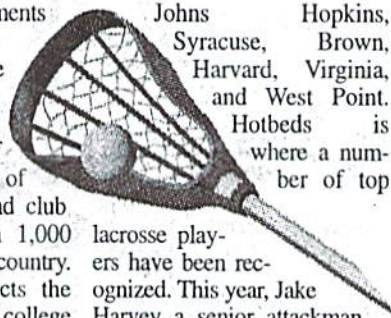
### Two local laxers shine at national tournament
