Vandalism Spree Hits Duxbury

The destruction of Draco the dragon on Tremont Street a week ago was not the only recent act of vandalism in Duxbury.

At 12:22 a.m. on Sunday, Dec. 3, an officer was conducting a routine check of Duxbury High School when he discovered nine broken windows in the rear of the building. Lt. Chip Chubb said the officer had also found a piece of asphalt at the scene, which the department thinks

was thrown to shatter the windows.

Several hours later, at 5:35 a.m. the department received a call from a man in Hall's Corner who reported that a store window at the Hall's Corner Store was broken. Chubb said a brick was found at the scene.

At 7:30 a.m., the Nudd family was told by a neighbor that someone had tipped over and destroyed Draco the dragon, the Duxbury mascot that

greets motorists along Route 3A.

Chubb said it is unknown whether all three incidents are related. He added that the department continues to investigate both incidents.

Supt. Eileen Williams confirmed on Thursday that nine windows at the high school

were broken and that the police were still investigating.

P. Das Patel, owner of the Hall's Corner Store, said nothing was stolen from his shop after his window was broken. He said glass from the window was strewn down the aisles of his Chestnut Street store. By Friday, Patel had already had the window replaced.
