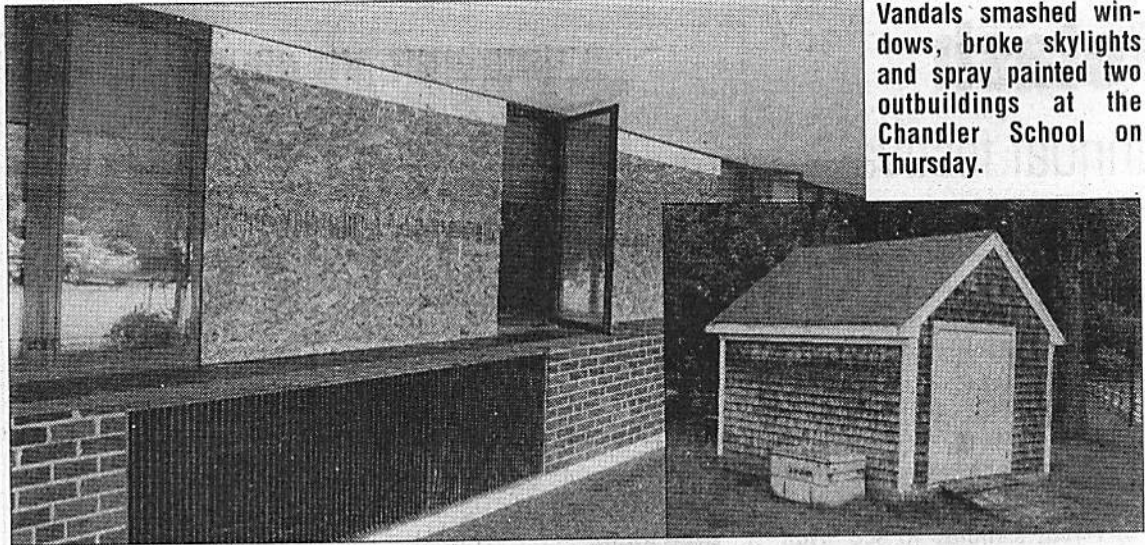

Vandals hit Chandler School

Around 2 a.m. on Thursday, June 16, police responded to an alarm call at the Chandler School. Arriving officers found a number of broken windows, a glass door and skylights smashed in, according to Lt. Lewis Chubb of the Duxbury Police.

"There was also a shed that was broken into and a concession stand that was spray painted," he said. He added that

nothing was reported stolen.

Chubb would not say exactly what was written on the shed before it was washed off.

"It's not anything of any concern to the public, it's not racial or sexual or anything of that nature. It was just graffiti," he said.

Police don't believe the incident was related to the Bruins' Stanley Cup victory earlier that night.

"It's still a very active in-

vestigation," Chubb said.

Chubb believes the culprits were able to do a large amount of damage because some of the vandalism, such as spray painting the sheds, did not trip the alarm. He said that the incident is serious, but not the worst case of vandalism he's seen at the schools, pointing out that hooligans at the high school once broke every window on two sides of the building.
