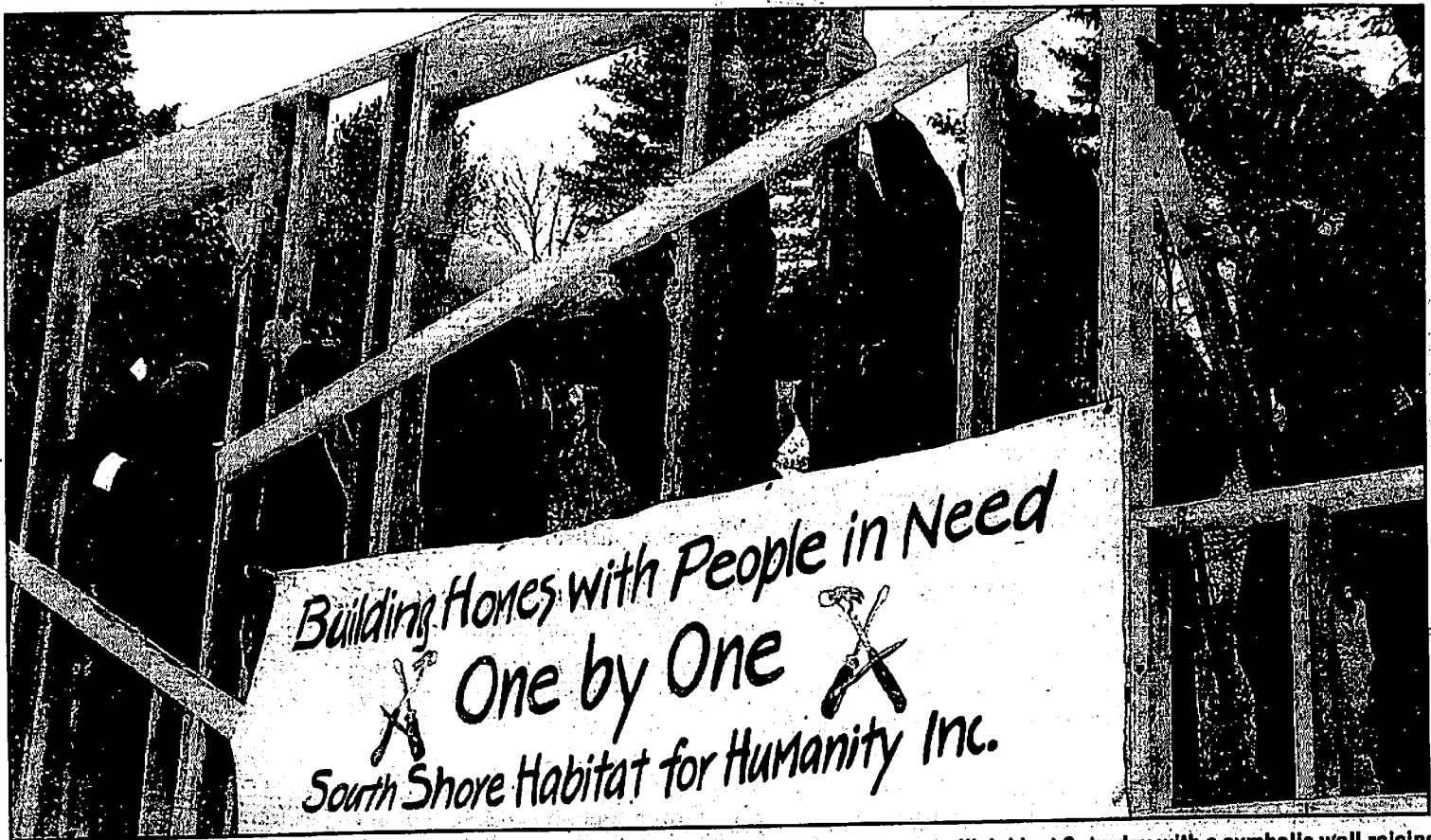


Habitat for Humanity
