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### **\$372,000 Water Pipe Relining Under Way on Washington Street**

Work began last week on a three phase project to improve water flow and quality along a two mile stretch of Washington Street.

Water Supt. Carl Hillstrom said the original cast iron water pipes first installed in 1917 on the street will be cleaned and relined with cement to make the interior of the piping smooth to avoid mineral buildup which can restrict flow.

Hillstrom said that during the process, customers may notice some slight disruption in service while temporary piping is chlorinated and the water mains are taken out of service for the project. There may be some traffic rerouting as well while access holes are dug every three to five hundred feet along the route, he said.

"We'll be doing the project in three phases," he said, "first from Hall's Corner to Surplus, Surplus to Harrison and then Harrison Street to St. George Street. The work should be completed by July."

Gisko Construction of Fall River was awarded the bid on the project, Hillstrom said.
