## Smith College Loan Exhibit

A loan exhibition from the Smith College Museum of Art, Northampton, will be on display in the Helen Bumpus Gallery of the Duxbury Free Library Aug. 11-Sept. 7.

The exhibition includes a collection of etchings and lithographs by the Anglo-American painter and printmaker James Abbott MacNeill Whistler.

Gay Youse, who plans and arranges gallery exhibitions for the library, has also included in this exhibition American paintings of the 19th and 20th centuries which illustrate the trend from wholly traditional to slightly impressionistic. Along with the American works, Miss Youse has included two French paintings of the same time period because of the great influence the French impressionists had on this development in American art.

According to Mrs. Richard Neubauer, Library Director, the exhibition has been borrowed from the Smith College Museum of Art in part because of the quality of the Smith collection and also to honor Mrs. H.C. Bumpus, a Smith graduate, whose gift to the Duxbury Free Library made possible the art gallery.

## Exhibition Set At Free Library

The loan exhibition was planned and arranged by Miss Gay Youse of Duxbury, who directs the gallery for the library. Mrs. Richard Neubauer is director of the library.
