Storm Sewer Upgrades on Timberbank Boulevard

Expected Construction Start Date: September 2013


Expected Completion Date: June 2014

As part of the Basement Flooding Protection Program, the City of Toronto will be modifying and upgrading the storm sewer system on Timberbank Boulevard (see map included in this notice):

These upgrades will help relieve surface and basement flooding in the area.

Your understanding and co-operation during the construction period is appreciated.

Construction Details

Construction is expected to take place from September 2013 to June 2014.

The construction of the storm sewer will involve trench excavation within the roadway, installation of new storm sewer pipes, reconnection of any existing sewer services, and addition of high capacity catch basins.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Generally, work will take place between 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday to Friday with occasional work on Saturdays between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm until the construction is completed. Work will not take place during statutory or other major holiday observances.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be some temporary inconveniences to the local community. During construction work hours, residents and businesses may experience some noise and vibration caused by excavation and construction equipment. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary and for periods during construction full road closure may be required.

Pedestrian and Vehicle Access

- At certain times during the work, vehicle and pedestrian traffic may be disrupted. Signs will be posted to advise of detours, lane closures and pedestrian crossings.
- Access to driveways and sidewalks may be restricted at times to allow for construction. Residents will be advised by on-site personnel.
- Emergency (police, fire and medical response) access will be maintained at all times.
- Recycling and garbage collection will not be affected. Please follow your normal routine.
- On-street parking may be restricted during the daytime. Affected residents may park on adjacent streets. Residents are advised not to park where on-street parking is prohibited. There will be no consideration for offences such as No Stopping, No Standing, Stopping on Sidewalks or Boulevards, by Fire Hydrants, Fire Route, Rush Hour Route and parking within 9 metres of intersection.
- During the winter season, the contractor will provide snow removal, disposal, and salting within the limits of the construction zone, including both the roadway and sidewalks.

The contractor will further notify you of any temporary disruptions. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience to the local community.

Important Advisories

- Residents are reminded to remove any unique landscaping and sprinkler systems that are located on the City portion of their property before work begins. Residents are also advised to delay any improvements to driveways until construction is completed.
- dBA Environmental Services, under contract with the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area prior to the September 2013 start date. The survey is on a voluntary basis; however, participating in the survey is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. The survey will include an inspection of both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting to set up survey appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during the survey.

Working with the Community

The City of Toronto is committed to communicating with you about the upcoming construction activities and anticipated disruptions. We will provide advance notice of disruptions and make every effort to minimize the inconvenience to the community.
