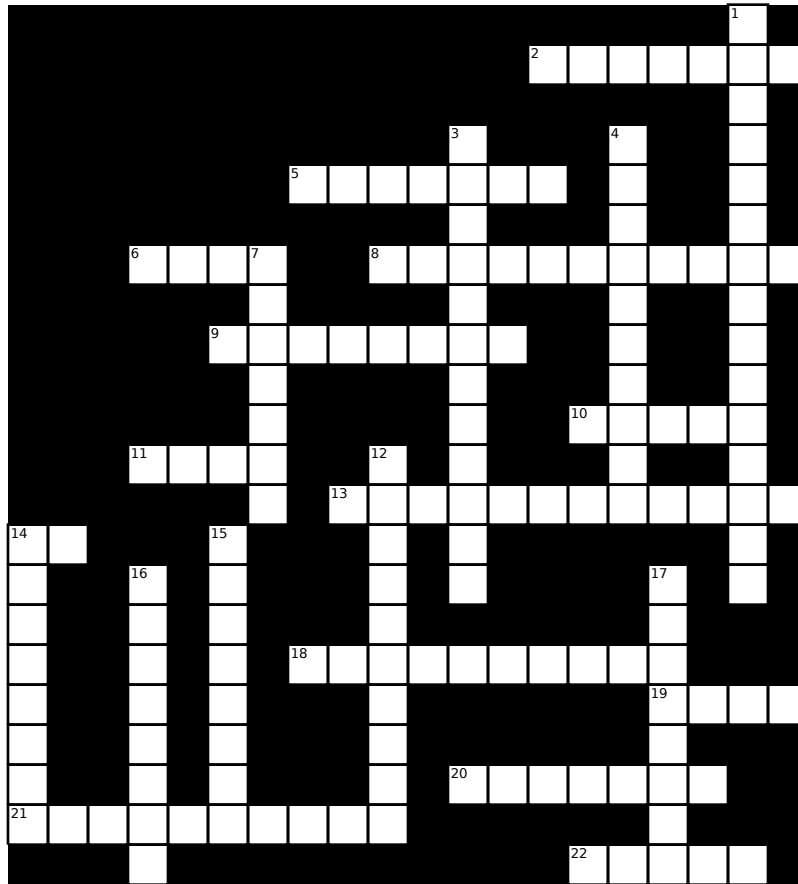


Rx of Angina

- 2 A rapidly acting antiplatelet drug that does not inhibit cyclooxygenase
- 5 This class of ion channel blocker can produce coronary vasodilation
- 6 When produced by guanylyl cyclase, this substance causes vasodilation
- 8 An antianginal drug contraindicated in the treatment of variant angina
- 9 A well known side effect of nitroglycerin
- 10 The acronym for a conduction resulting from a transmural infarct
- 11 A name for a woman, who should always greet patients at the door of the emergency room who are having chest pain
- 13 A treatment for a newly formed fibrin clot that produces ST elevation
- 14 A stimulator of guanylyl cyclase
- 18 A drug used as an alternative treatment for patients not responding to other first line antianginal drugs
- 19 The condition where variant angina is most likely to occur
- 20 The form of angina resulting from a fixed stenosis of a coronary artery
- 21 The most common route of administration for nitroglycerin
- 22 A mechanical treatment for exertional angina

- 1 A non-nitrate drug subclass used to treat angina that can produce a reflex tachycardia
- 3 The subcellular organelle containing the enzyme responsible for converting nitroglycerin to its active metabolite
- 4 A form of angina resulting from vasospasm
- 7 The cardiac parameter that is reduced by low doses of nitrates
- 12 This drug is unsafe when taken with a nitrate
- 14 The mainstay of therapy for the immediate relief of angina
- 15 A drug of choice for treating beta-blocker overdose
- 16 A form of angina resulting from a fractured atherosclerotic plaque
- 17 A condition where the most common form of angina is most likely to occur
