The Court finds the following:

1. At the present time the parties have joint legal custody of the minor children in this case.
2. There has been an ongoing issue of violation of the joint legal custody provisions, most specifically centered around the Plaintiff-Mother obtaining psychological evaluation and following through with the evaluation and resulting in the treating physician prescribing ADHD medication.
3. The child, Rocco, is the minor child who is on ADHD medication, and has been on this medication for quite some time. The psychological evaluation which recommended the ADHD medication, said report dated September 18, 2013 by Dr. Pfander.
4. The school has indicated the child does well when on the medication.
5. When the Plaintiff-Mother contacted the physician to refill the prescriptions for the medications, the physician indicated that Defendant-Father contacted him and stated that he is prohibited from prescribing the medication due to the joint legal provisions of the orders in effect in this case.
6. It is the opinion of the Friend of the Court that due to the fact that the child has been on the ADHD medication continuously for quite some time, and given the input from Dr. Pfander and the various school officials and individuals who have been working and tutoring with Rocco, that an order should be entered allowing the prescriptions to be refilled and allowing the minor child to take said prescriptions for ADHD.

IT IS ORDERED that the attending physician for the minor child, Rocco, is allowed to prescribe the medications for ADHD which the minor child has taking, and it is allowed for the minor child to take the medications in spite of the joint legal custody provisions of the orders in this case.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any joint legal custody issues shall be reserved for trial.
