Tony,

You are wondering whether Judge Borchard is going to view the current situation with the kids as something that is your fault. I don't believe he will.

I only see two options at this point:

1. That Melissa reschedule a flight out for the children and comes to Maryland and flies back with them; or
2. You fly back with the kids again.

I understand you cannot take time off from work and that the earliest you could return the kids would be late Friday afternoon or some time Saturday or Sunday. I would like confirmation from your employer that they would not be happy with you taking off a day of work Monday through Friday to return the kids.

I think what needs to be done is somehow you need to communicate with Melissa again and tell that the two of you need to agree on when the kids are to be returned and need to agree on who it is that is going to bring them to Flint.

Under no circumstances do I think the court will force you to put the kids on a plane where there is going to be a change of planes required. For Melissa to now insist they be flown into Tri-City is ridiculous because a change of planes would be necessary.

It is funny that she will not communicate with you unless directed to do so by her attorney.

I would like you to find out what the cost would be for you or Melissa and the children to be flown back to Michigan.

I would also like to have document from Southwest Airlines that the children could not possibly have flown last week if they had no ID.

You need to communicate all this to Melissa somehow (or unless you want us to do it through McLeod) and let her know that she needs to get Michigan ID for the kids since they have been living in Michigan since the kidnapping.

I don't know the laws of Maryland but I think it is doubtful you could have gotten Maryland ID for them now. You might want to check on that as well.

Also, we know that Saginaw Township Schools have been closed up to this point. I need you to document what has happened with the kids each day since they were to have been returned to Michigan.

I want you to also document that you have been sending Melisa texts, emails and have tried to talk to her by phone about resolving this issue.

I believe if you pay for their airfare and pay for your own roundtrip ticket, you should be able to file a petition with the court for reimbursement, but knowing how judges act in resolving these issues I do not believe the judge will refund you the money that you spend to get the kids back to Michigan, nor do I think the judge will withhold alimony from her to make it up to you.

Do what you think is best for your children. Obviously, Melissa is not doing that. Instead, all she tells you basically is that your daughter should man up and you should have had better parenting skills instead of making Mia even more afraid to fly than she actually is.

I would like Melissa to get in front of the judge and say all these things only to realize that the kids couldn't have been flown anyway without ID.

If you want to try to work this out with Melissa the next day or so, obviously do so. Otherwise, tomorrow I would propose we send out some type of letter to McLeod spelling out some of this information contained in this email.

I will have my phone on the rest of my vacation. I will be back in the office next Monday. Feel free to call me any time.
