I've got TVP10. I'm on a **PC**.

**Why can't I see H.264 option in the compression in the export setting?**

I didn't see anything that said compression "type", only compression and it didn't have any option like H.264, it just had a 1-100 option.

A

Since you are on a PC your export settings will be slightly different than on a MAC.

Two other WIKI FAQ pdf's address this.. but here is the answer again, since you asked.

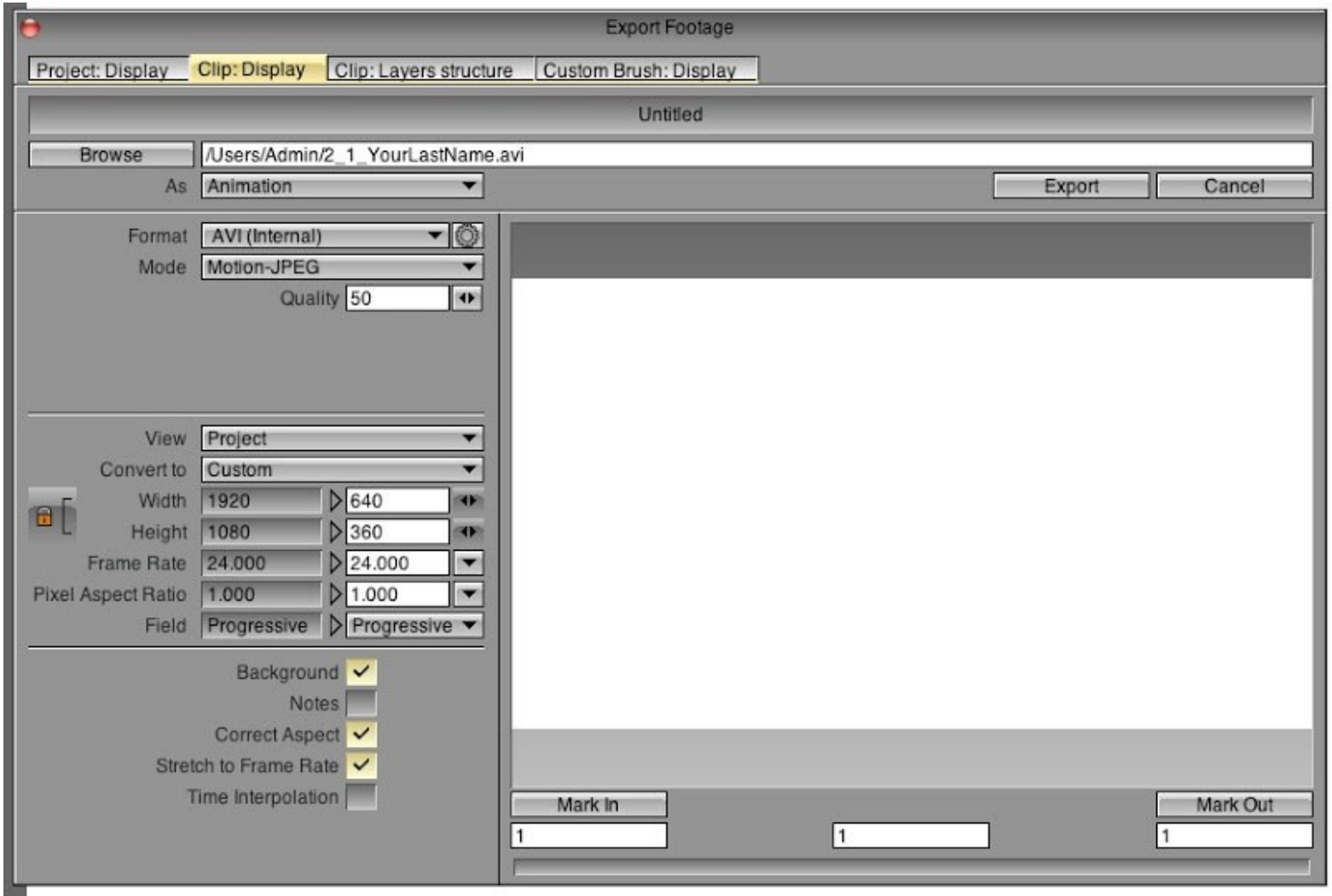
What are the exact **EXPORT** SETTINGS from TVP10 on **PC**?

Export options are different for Windows , because Apple no longer supports Quicktime for Windows, so if you use Windows you would use the Internal AVI export option (in Motion JPEG mode) which lets you adjust the percentage of the compression .

For most things a setting of between 50% - 70% compression is sufficient. You can set the compression percentage higher , 80% , 90% , 100% , but it will result in a larger file size . Try around 60% .



To export from PC ( from TVP10) go to

**File Menu** > Export --

Export As > Animation

Format > AVI (internal),

Mode> *Motion-JPEG*

Compression Quality > 50% - to - 70%

( 50% compression will work fine for most things . If you need to increase the resolution you may bump up the compression quality to 60% or 70% , 80% ... whatever looks good. Increasing the compression quality will increase the file size.)

Frames Per Second = 24 FPS (***always 24 FPS***)

Note that in the screen capture image above

the original project size was 16:9 aspect ratio 1920 x 1080,

but for exporting I've downscaled the size to **640 x 360**

which will make a smaller file size to upload to the class discussion board.

Frame Rate = 24

Pixel Aspect Ratio = 1.000

Field = Progressive

Background - CHECK ✓

Notes - unchecked

Correct Aspect - CHECK ✓

Stretch to frame rate - CHECK ✓

Time Interpolation - unchecked

Export Sound Track - Check ✓ (IF there is sound , otherwise leave this Unchecked) .

After making sure that these settings are correct and you have NAMED your movie and selected a destination folder on your computer ("My ANM180 class projects" or something like that) click on **EXPORT**.

naming convention will be

**01\_SmithJohn\_v1.avi**

That means this is the first project/ by Smith John/ his first version

If the instructor allows avi deliveries you are set.

If you need to convert this to a mov use a file convertor tool

like Quicktime Pro 7 or Adobe Media Encoder to convert your avi to a mov

If the avi is too large to deliver you will need to convert to something with more compression.

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
