Liberal Arts Certificate – 2009-2010

What?

- ♦ The Liberal Arts Certificate is 30 credit hours made up of 10 classes.

How?

- ♦ Access courses at your regional college face-to-face, online or televised to suit your schedule. Your choice!

Why Liberal Arts?

- ♦ You can study part-time or full-time. Your choice!
- ♦ The Liberal Arts Certificate can lead into a Bachelor of Arts degree or can stand alone as a complete program.
- ♦ Certificates introduce students to a broad range of subjects.

Who?

- ♦ This program will be offered through the regional colleges and through distance learning (online and televised offerings) to meet the needs of students who are looking to complete a certificate while remaining in their own community. Students are encouraged to contact an Academic Advisor.

****List A:** catholic studies, classical studies, health studies, humanities, intercultural leadership, interdisciplinary studies, international studies, languages (including 200 or 300 level English courses), linguistics, philosophy, religious studies, science and technology studies, and women's studies.

****List B:** anthropology, catholic studies, economics, geography, health studies, history, Indigenous studies Indian health studies, intercultural leadership, interdisciplinary studies international studies, political science, psychology, sociology or social studies, and women's studies.

Eligibility further requires that : 1) Students have taken at the U of R at least 50% of the 10 courses; 2) Attained an average grade of 60% in the 10 courses; and 3) Completed (or received transfer credit) the required 10 courses within the first 45 credit hours of courses taken (or granted transfer credit) at the U of R.
