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In my lifetime, I have dealt with many forms of diversity. I grew up in the inner city of Waterbury CT. However, I would not say that attending a public high school for four years was the biggest diversity struggle I have yet endured. I would say that would be this year. Attending URI, I have not seen any diversity on campus. It actually shocked me when I found that there are few minorities on campus. Dealing with attending school with underprivileged teens, I never found went through the culture shock that many students do; rather it was just normal.
