



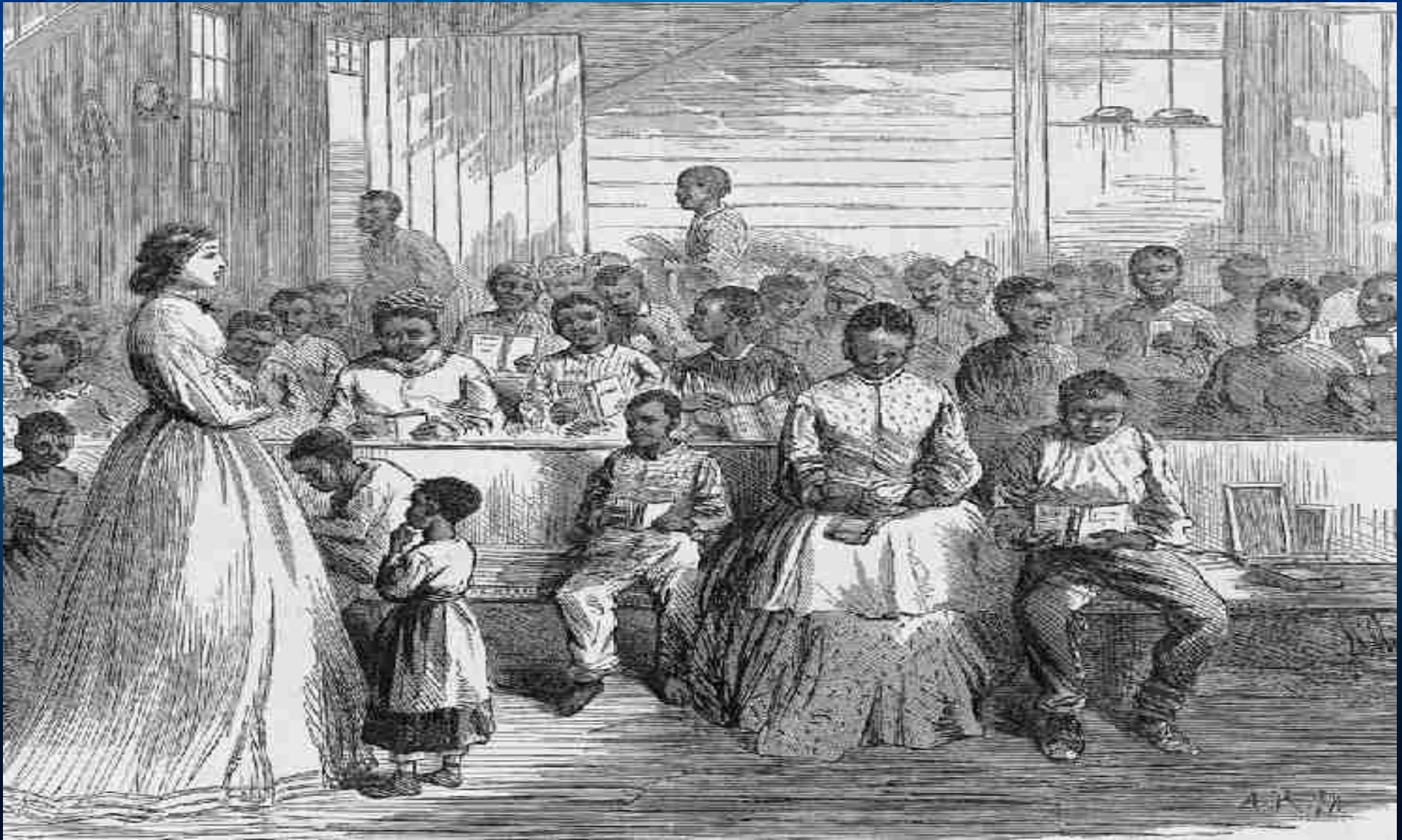
The Faces of Reconstruction



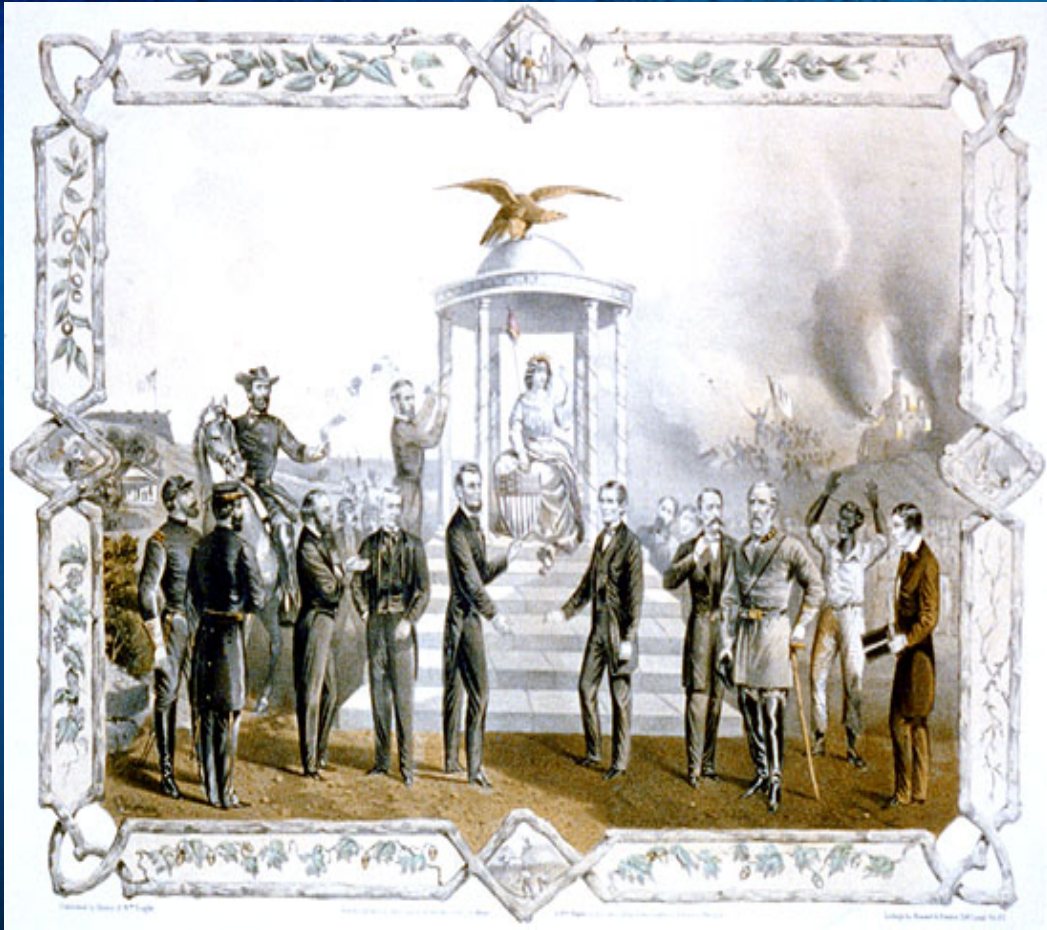
Freedmen working to earn a living as sharecroppers at the end of slavery in the South.



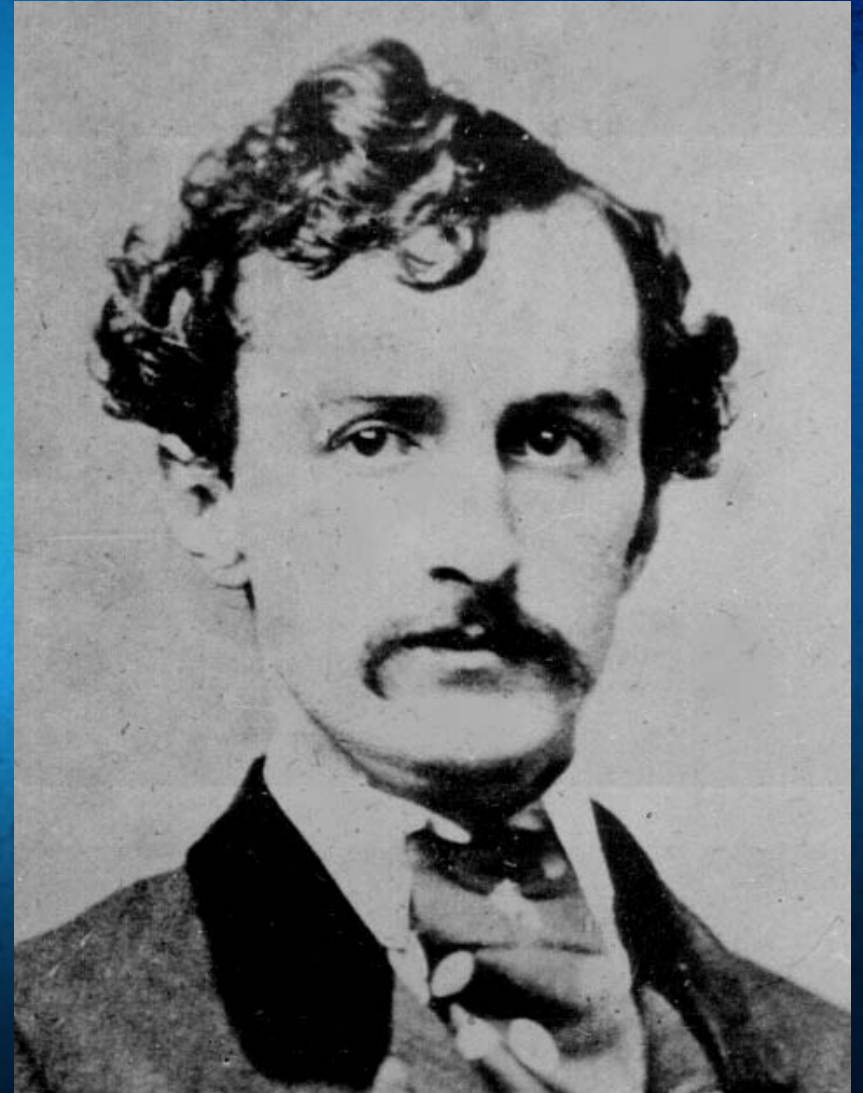
Freedmen Bureau in the south, after the civil war. The Freedmen Bureau helped freedmen get their lives together.

Political Cartoon about Lincoln and Johnson about the repairing the union. Johnson wants revenge while Lincoln just wants to get the union back together.



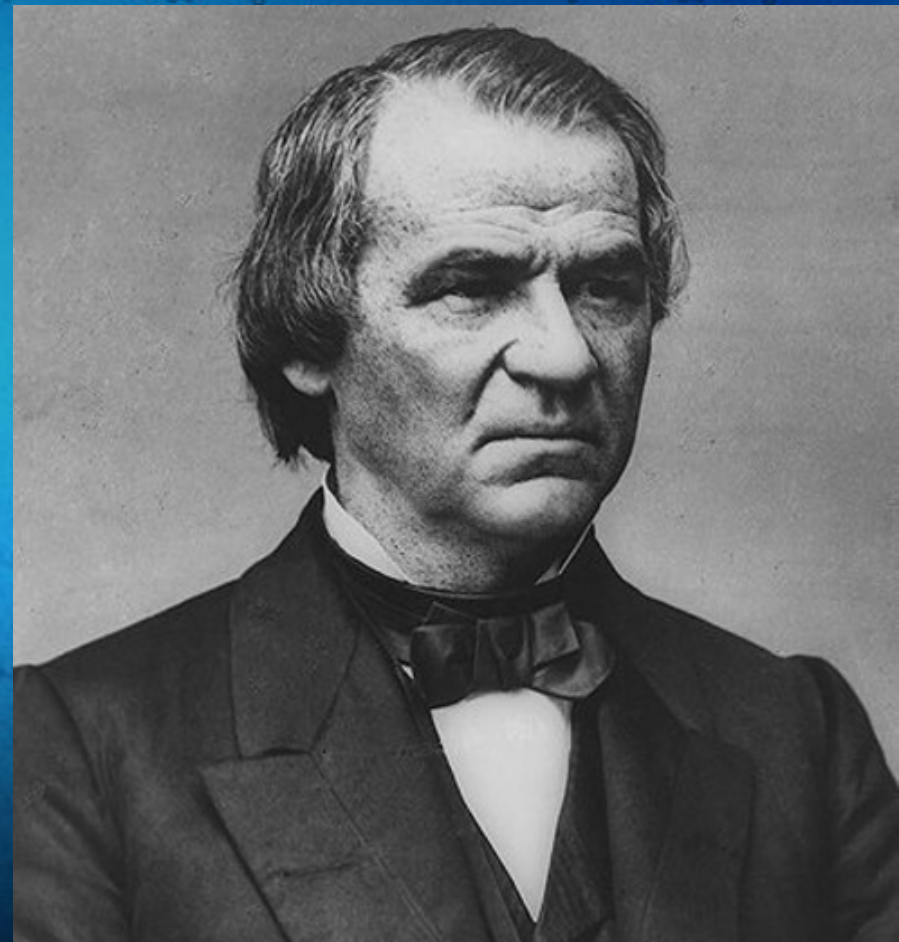
During Reconstruction Carpetbaggers were outside northerners who came South to profit from southern Civil War losses.

Charleston, South Carolina, lays in ruins after the civil war. Here black children sit on a step because they have nowhere else to go.



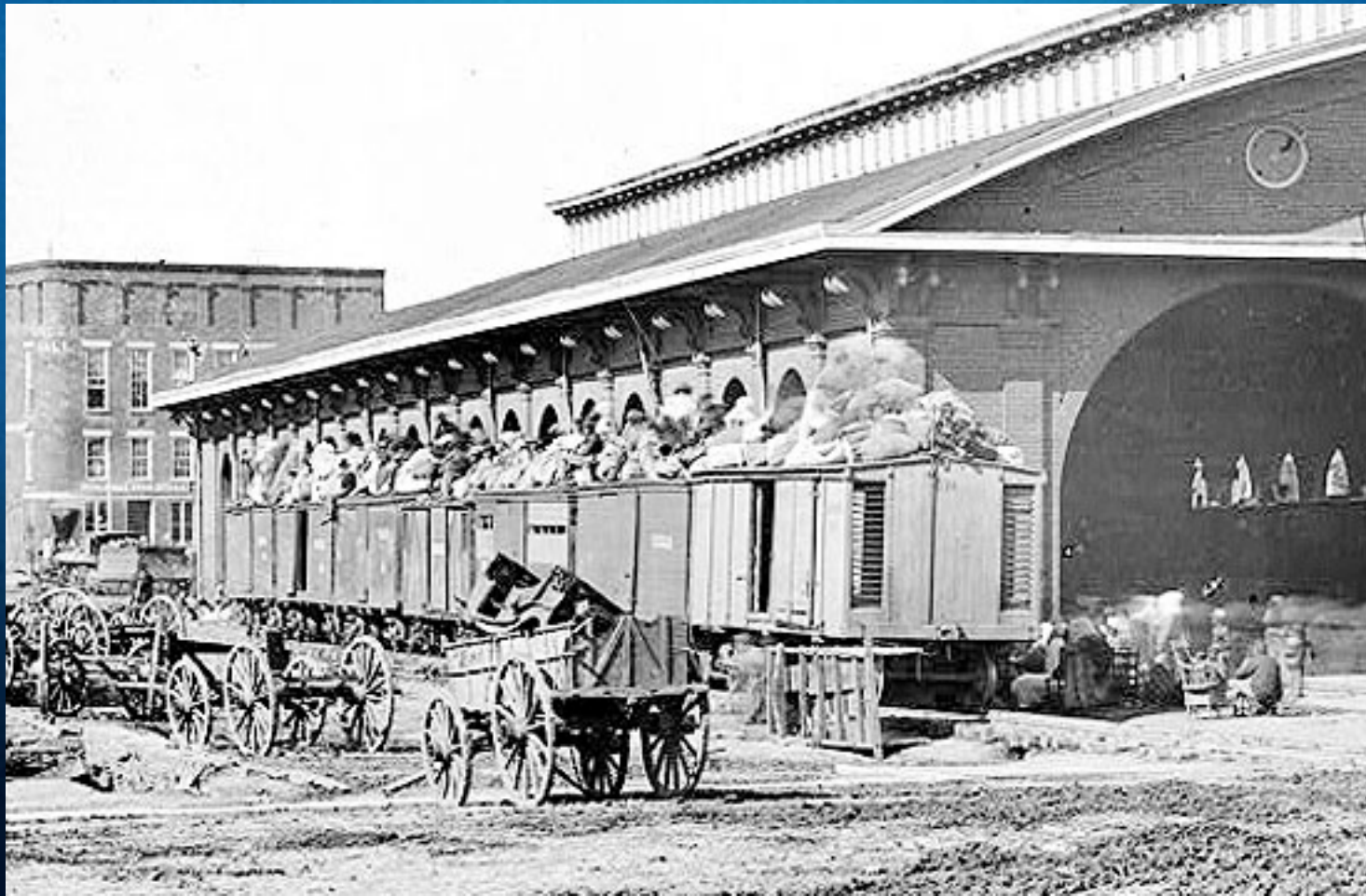
Andrew Johnson - took office after Lincoln was assassinated by John Wilkes Booth in 1865.



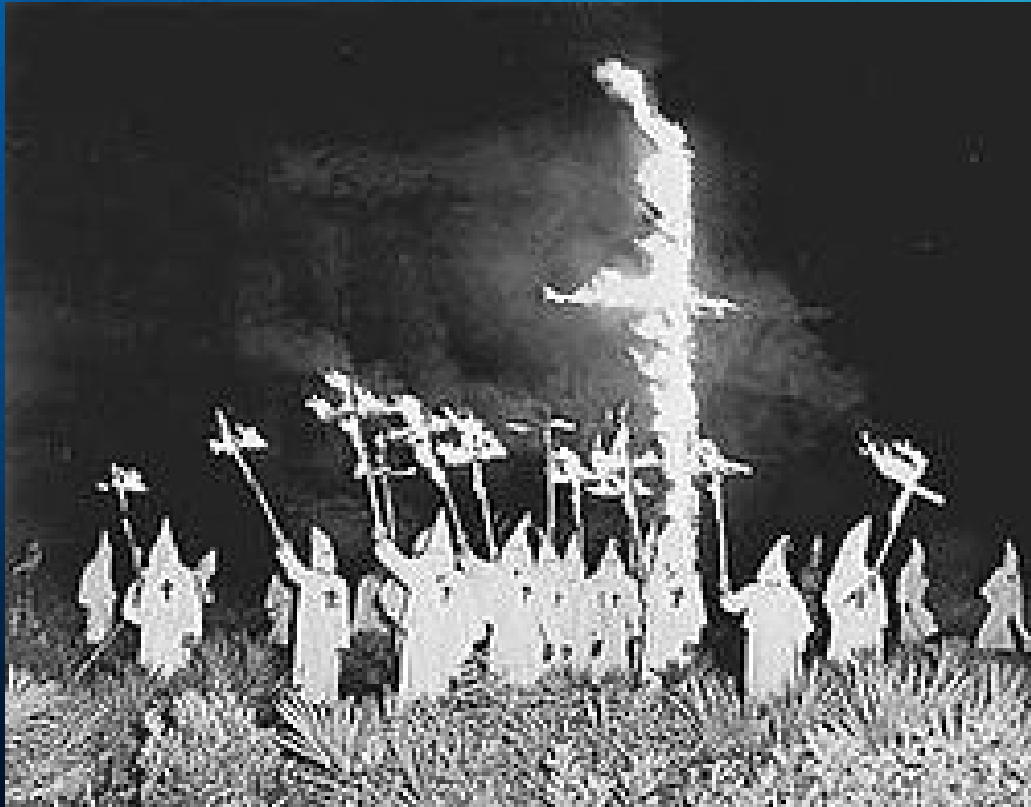
The fifteenth amendment was about preventing the federal government from restricting voting based on race, gender, and religious beliefs or the fact that they had been slaves.
