This picture shows the rivalry between the Confederates and the Union, which had to be resolved after the war.



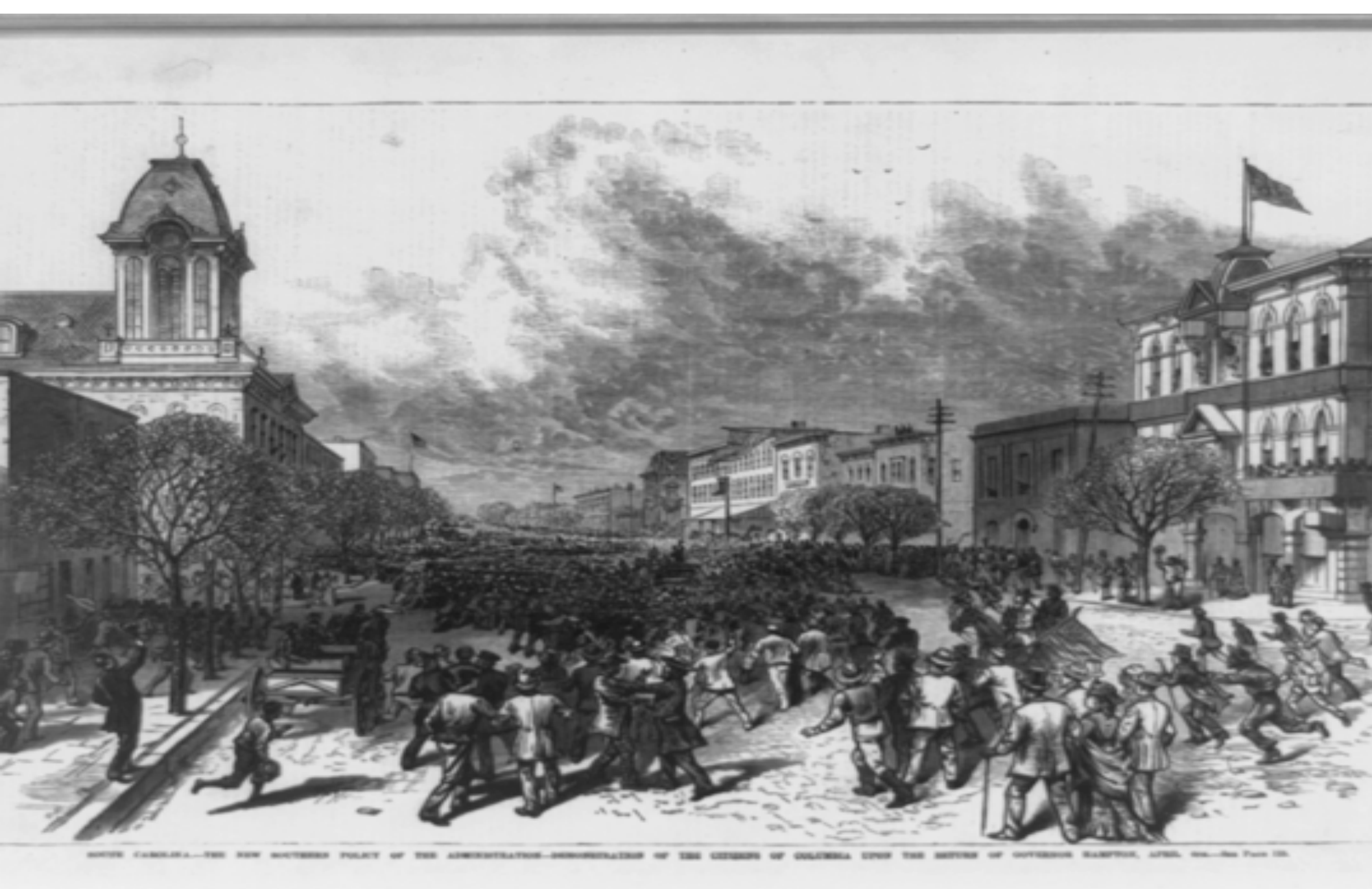

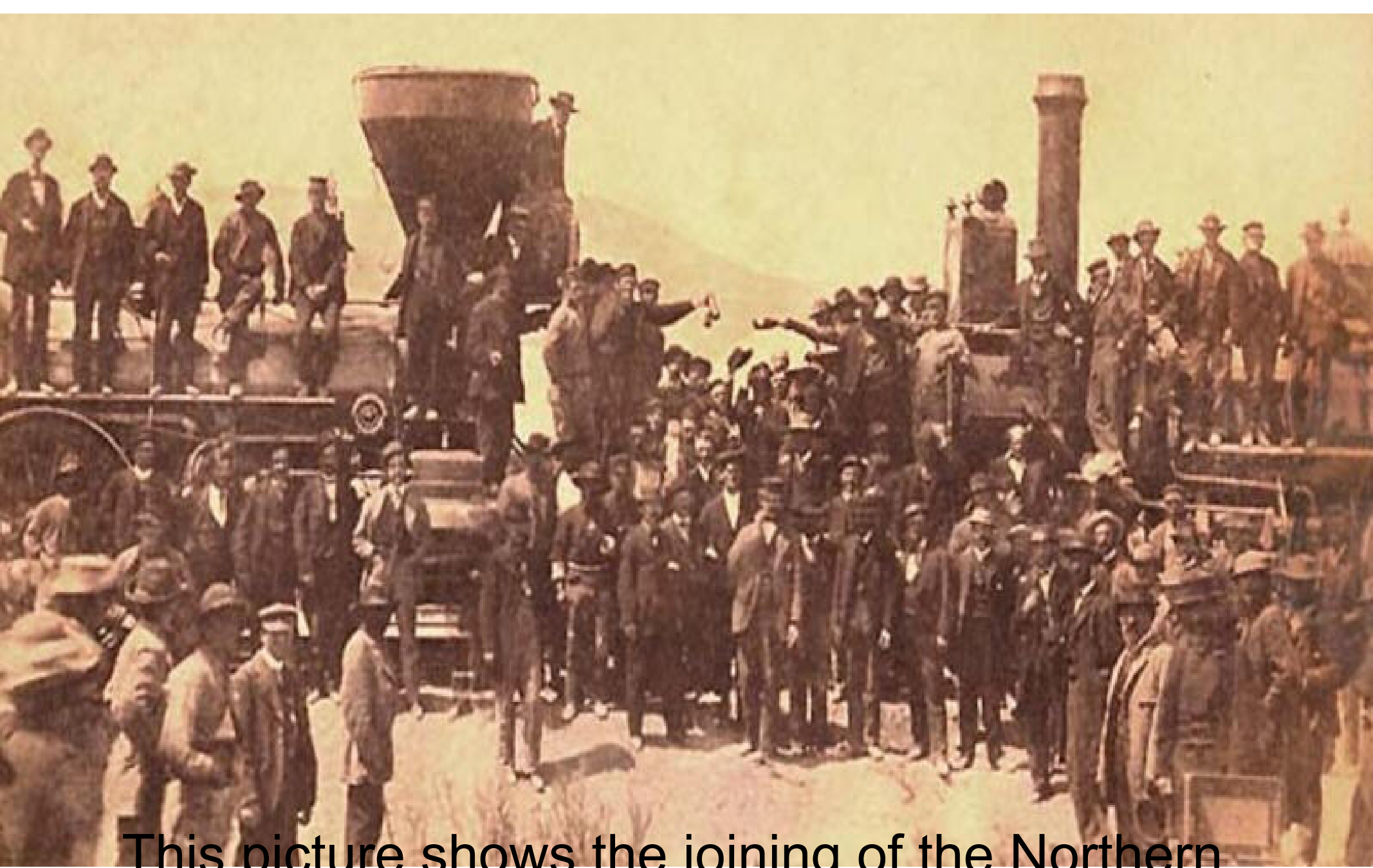
This picture shows the unity of The U.S. coming back together after the Civil War.

APPROPRIATED BY CONGRESS,  
FOR THE WHITE MAN,  
**HEAVY TAXES, HARD LABOR**

For 1864 and 1865, the FREEDMAN'S BUREAU cost the Tax-payers of the Nation, at least, **TWENTY-FIVE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS**. For 1866, THE SHARE of the Tax-payers of  
 Pennsylvania will be about **ONE** **MILLION OF DOLLARS**. **GEARY** is FOR the Freedman's Bureau. **CLYMER** is OPPOSED to it.

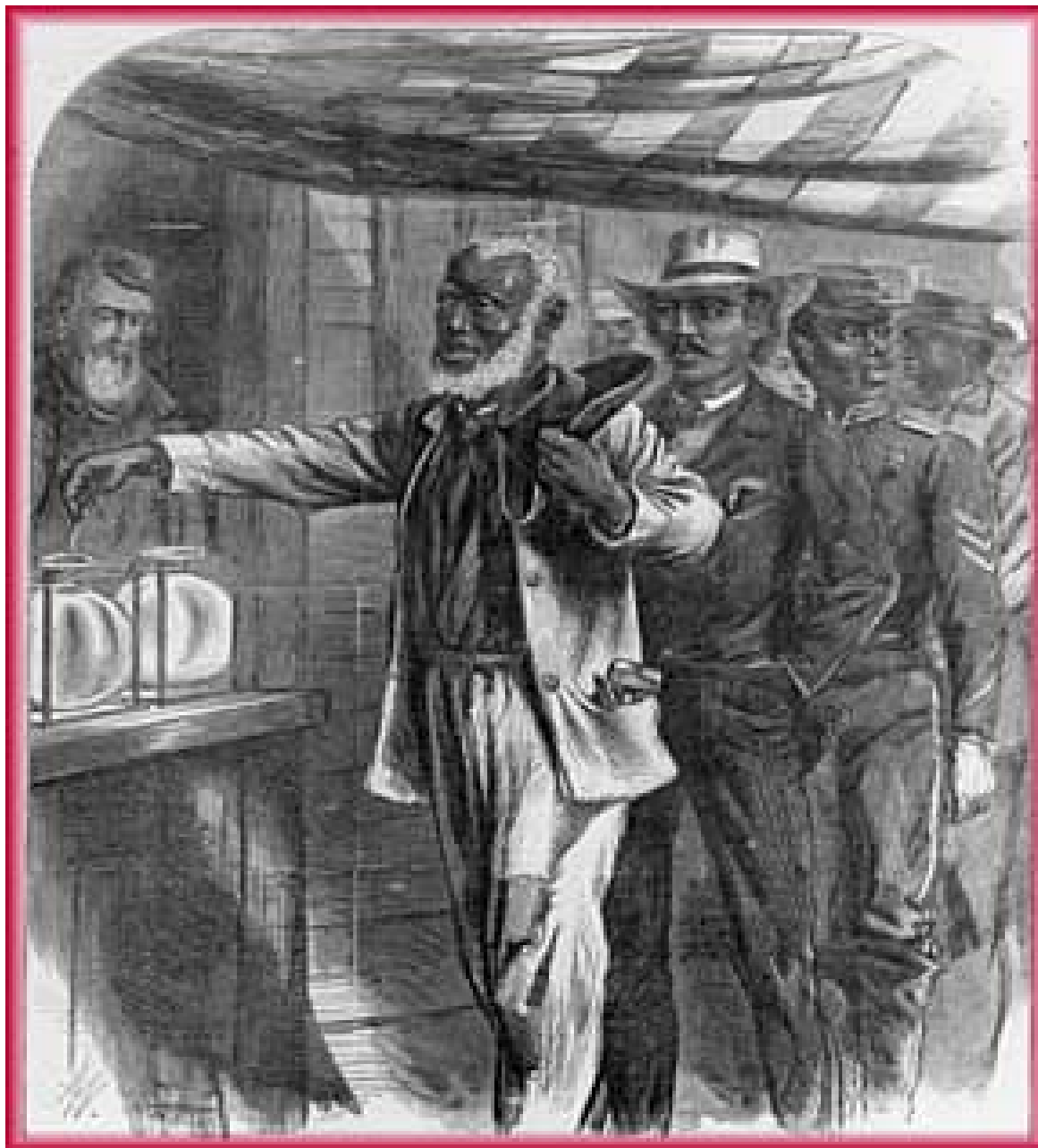

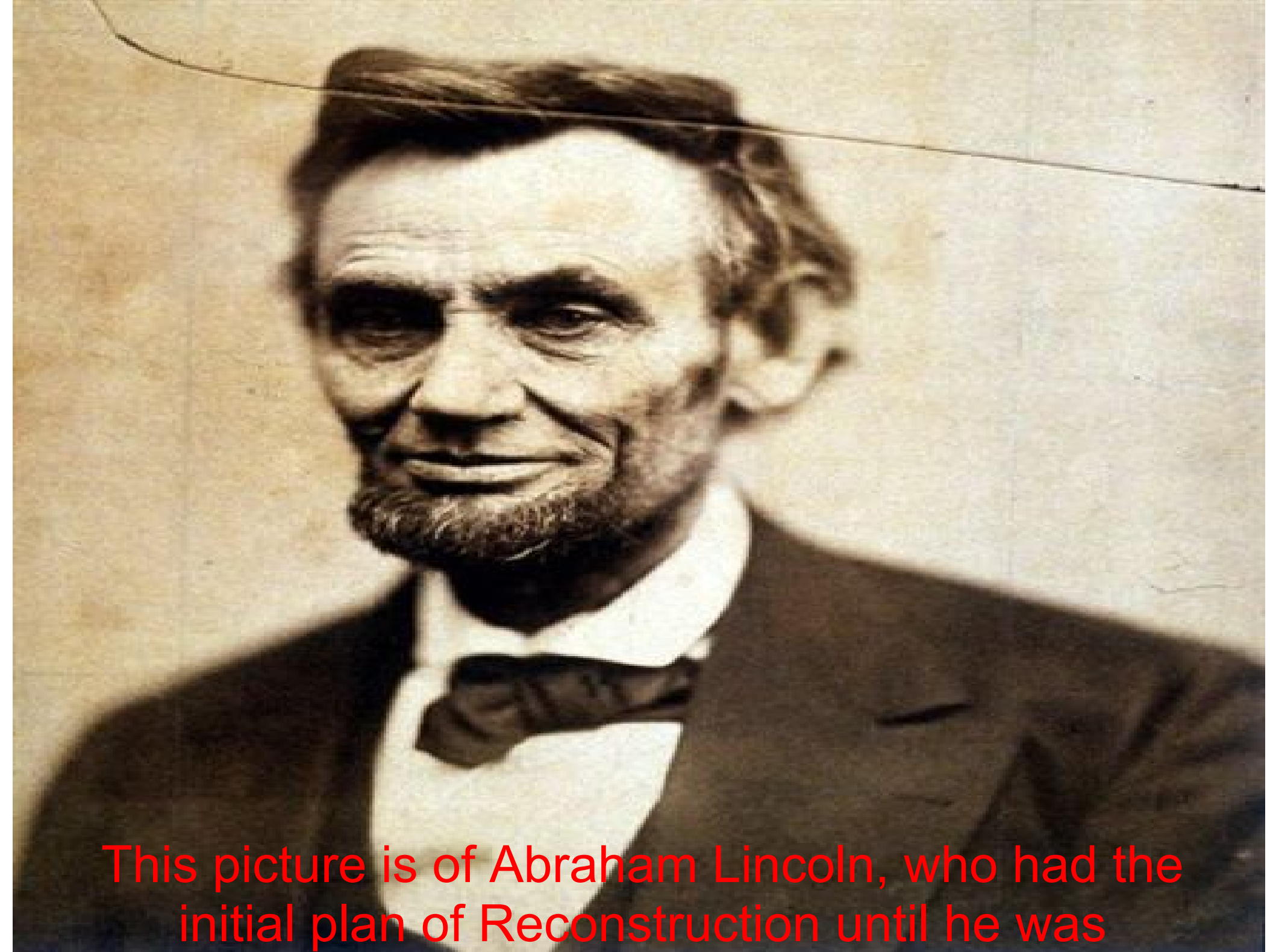






This picture shows a Freedman being attacked by the KKK in post-Civil War America.

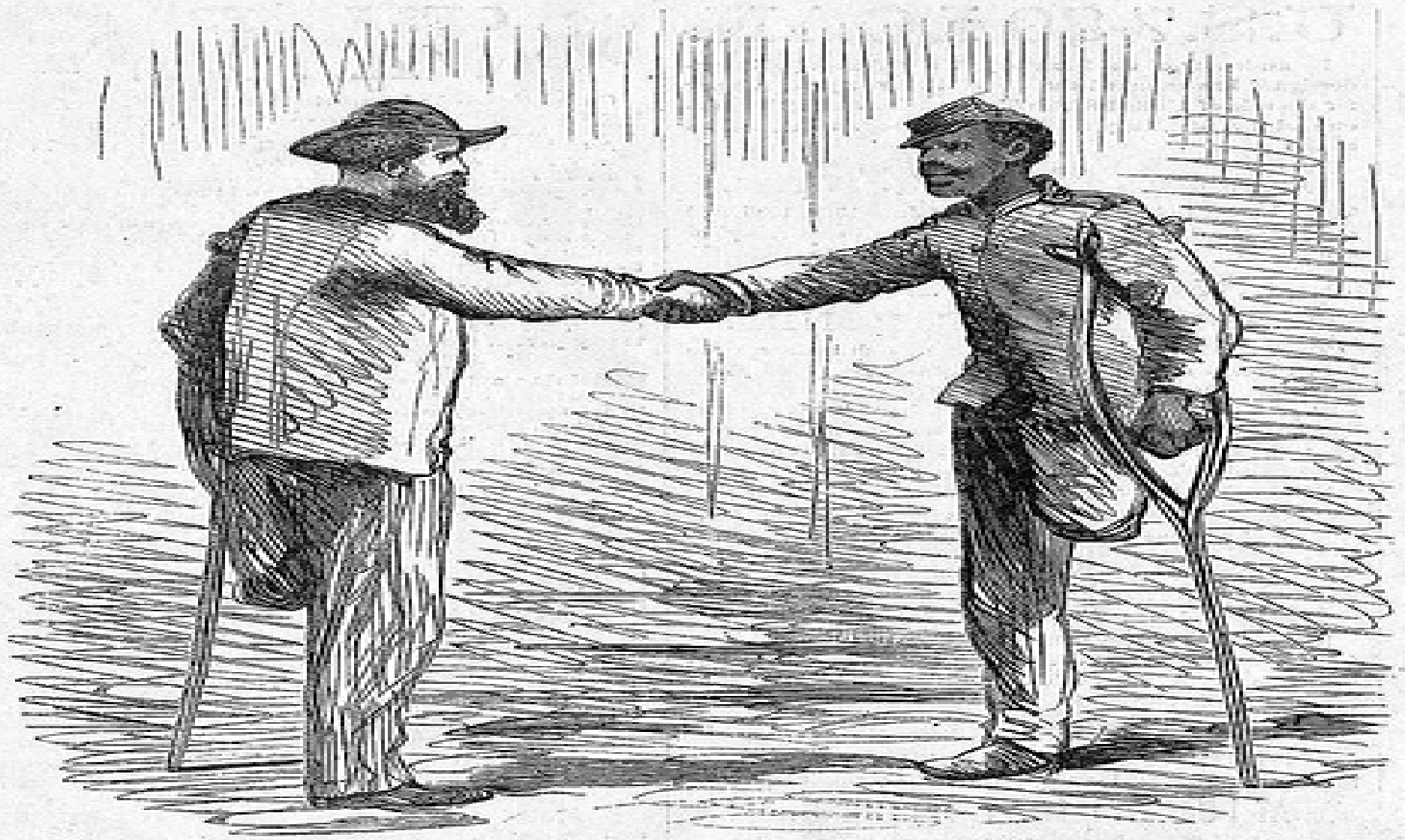
This picture shows a soldier declaring freedom to everyone in the U.S. after the Civil War.





This picture shows a slave telling his owner of how he is now a freed man.



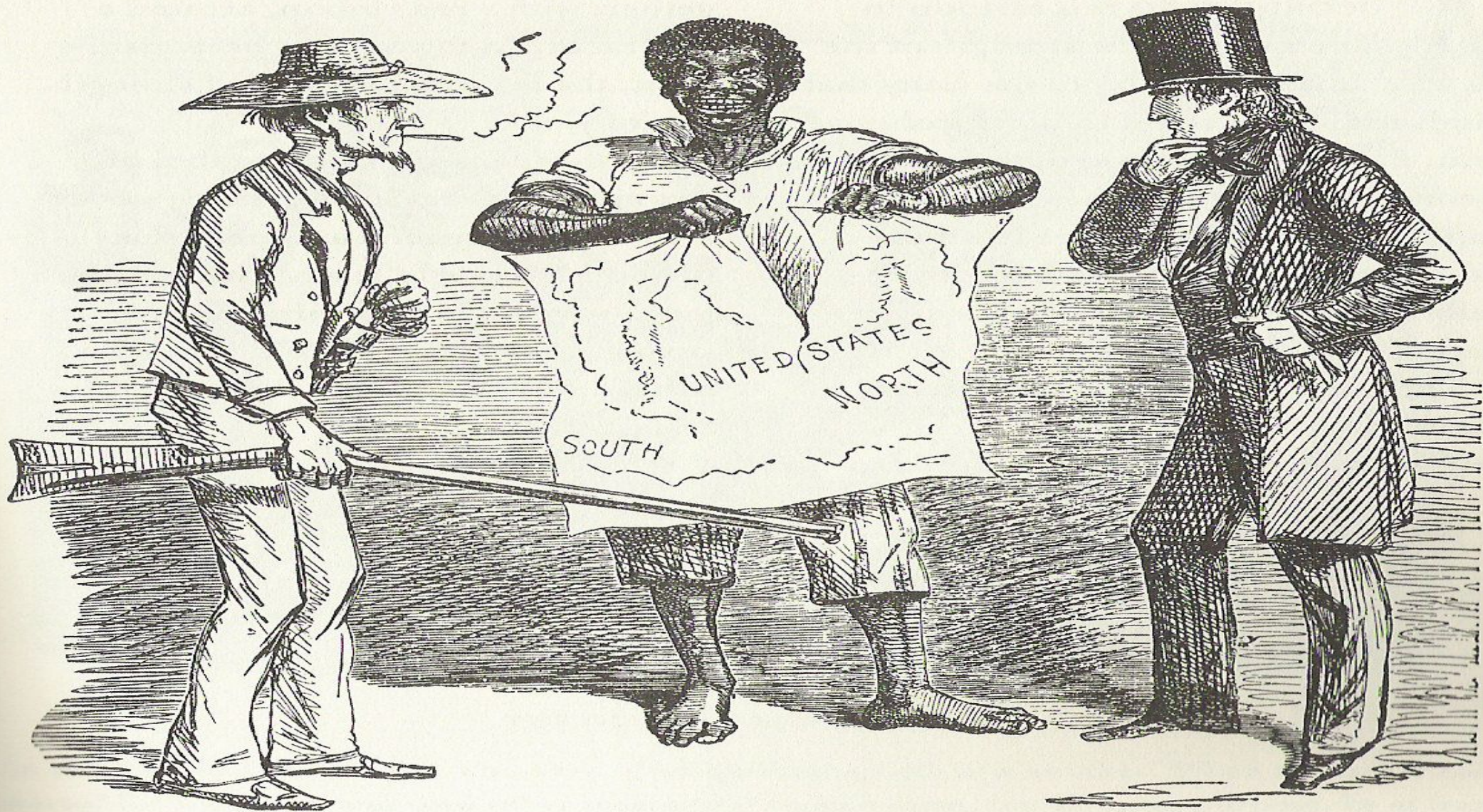


**A MAN KNOWS A MAN.**
