Airplanes

first flight in 1903 by the Wright Brothers - first practical use was to deliver the mail - first used in combat in WW I

Urban Sprawl

the outward growth of cities - caused by the popularity of the automobile

Mitchell Palmer

US Attorney General warning of the threat of a Communist take over in the US - Launched the Palmer Raids to stop a takeover

The Ohio Gang

Warren Harding's cabinet - mostly corrupt

Return to Normalcy

Harding
campaign slogan
helping him win
the 1920 election

Assembly Line

Developed by Henry Ford and applied to the auto industry - breaks jobs down into tasks

Marcus Garvey

US immigrant from Jamaica - stated the African Americans would never achieve justice in the US

trial centered around John Scopes teaching evolution his Tennessee classroom - found guilty
