Dividing line between North Korea and South Korea

Armas

Berlin Airlift

Successful US and British efforts to break the Soviet blockade of Berlin - they flew in supplies

Blockade of Berlin

to show opposition
to the unification of
Germany

going to the edge
of war - threaten
to use all the

Chaing Kai-Shek

Nationalist
leader of China
- US supported
him

Containment

US policy to
keep
communism
from spreading

Dulles

Secretary of State
under Pres.
Eisenhower -
Believed in
Brinkmanship

Europe

US was upset about
SU's activities in this
area after WW II. SU
forces controlled much
of this area after WW II

Eisenhower
Doctrine

Warned the SU
against military
actions in the
Middle East

General Mac Arthur

Became a hero for his actions during the Korean War. Later relieved of command because of actions.

Guzman

Leader of Guatemala that gave away American owned land

House Committee on Un-American Activities

investigated everybody for possible communist connections - esp. Hollywood

Hydrogen Bomb

Developed by the US because the SU had developed the Atomic Bomb

Iron Curtain

imaginary line
dividing communist
and democratic
European
countries

Khrushchev

Soviet leader
after Stalin. He
criticized Stalin

Truman Doctrine
