Germans pushed  
through the Allied  
front line - last  
German advance

**Selective  
Service  
Training Act**

created the first  
peace-time  
draft

**Internment  
Camps**

Japanese living in  
the US were  
forced to live here  
after Pearl Harbor

had the US government  
compensate Japanese

# V-J Day

Victory in Japan  
Day - when Japan  
surrendered -  
ended the Pacific  
part of the war

# Partisans

Italian civilian militia that helped the Allies - They captured Mussolini

# Island Hopping

Used by US in the Pacific to successfully make their way to Japan

Russian city targeted by Germany for a take over. Russia successfully held out!
