EBSCO's *Historical Digital Archives* consist of rare and unique materials crossing eras and academic disciplines.

## American Antiquarian Society (AAS) Historical Periodicals Collections

- Series 1 (1691-1820)
- Series 2 (1821-1837)
- Series 3 (1838-1852)
- Series 4 (1853-1865)
- Series 5 (1866-1877)



Provides digital access to the most comprehensive collection of American periodicals published between 1691 and 1877. Included are digitized images of American magazines and journals never before available outside the walls of the AAS, and are not available for acquisition in digital form from any other source.

## ATLA Historical Monographs Collections, Series 1 and 2

- Series 1 (1300's-1893)
- Series 2 (1894-1922)



Provides access to more than 29,000 titles focused on religion and theology, and is an invaluable resource for understanding religious thought and practice in the 19th and early 20th centuries. With material dating mostly from 1850 through 1922, it documents a time of great doctrinal, social, and organizational turmoil and upheaval in American culture.

## African American Historical Serials Collection



Developed in conjunction with the American Theological Library Association (ATLA) as part of an effort to preserve endangered serials related to African American religious life and culture, the collection documents the history of African American life and religious organizations from materials published between 1829-1922.

## The Latino-Hispanic American Experience:

### The Arte Público Hispanic Historical Collection Series 1



Presents a digital collection of historical content pertaining to U.S. Hispanic history, literature, and culture, this collection accurately conveys the creative life of U.S. Latinos and Hispanics – shedding new light on the intellectual vigor and traditional values that have characterized them from the earliest moments of this country's history through contemporary times.

## The Latino-Hispanic American Experience:

### Leaders, Writers, and Thinkers

### The Arte Público Hispanic Historical Collection Series 2



Focuses on the evolution of Hispanic civil rights, religious thought, and women writers from the late 19th and 20th centuries. Over 250,000 pages of personal and archival manuscript collections are available for viewing – including photographs, letters, diaries, and hundreds of rare Latino-Hispanic newspapers, magazines, and books from throughout the United States.

## Civil War Primary Source Documents



Primary source materials from the *New-York Historical Society* chronicle various aspects of the American Civil War. Comprised of over 110,000 pages of content from over 400 individual collections, this database captures accounts of the Civil War as it was experienced on land and at sea.

## Revolutionary War Era Orderly Books from the New-York Historical Society



Contains handwritten volumes documenting military orders, movements and engagements by brigade, regiment, company and other specific military units between 1748 and 1817. The content provides detailed accounts of troops' daily lives, including the price of necessities charged by locals.

## Gateway to North America: The People, Places, and Organizations of 19th-Century New York



Contains over 800,000 pages of content from over 1,500 print and manuscript directories, member lists, and other sources, chronicling the people and organizations of New York City from the late 18th through the early 20th century.

## African American Archives



Provides over one million pages of original historical documents pertaining to the African American experience over several centuries, and is richly-detailed with personal stories and narrative accounts. The earliest materials in this collection come from *Essential Records Concerning Slavery and Emancipation from the Danish West Indies* (1672-1917).

## Native American Archives



Provides more than 1.8 million pages of original historical documents pertaining to Native American history and life from the 18th through the 20th century. This collection includes ratified treaties that occurred between the U.S. government and American Indian tribes, related correspondence, a chronological list of treaties, and indexes by both place and tribe.

## World War II Archives



Contains over half a million pages of original historical documents compiled from the National Archives. It chronicles events during World War II, providing an in-depth perspective of military activities, while documenting the lives of military personnel on land, in the air, and at sea.

## American Revolution Archives



Contains over 4.7 million pages of original historical documents culled from materials at the National Archives that pertain to the Revolutionary War, chronicle military strategies, and recount the lives of individual soldiers.

## United States Bureau of Investigation Case File Archives



Covers case files from the U.S. government agency later known as the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Containing over 2.2 million pages of original historical documents, this archive includes tales of espionage during World War I, case files for German aliens who were politically suspect, and records pertaining to Mexican neutrality.

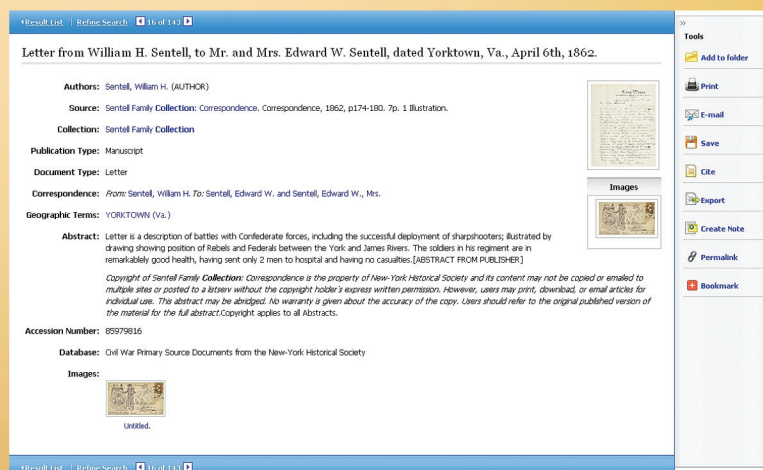
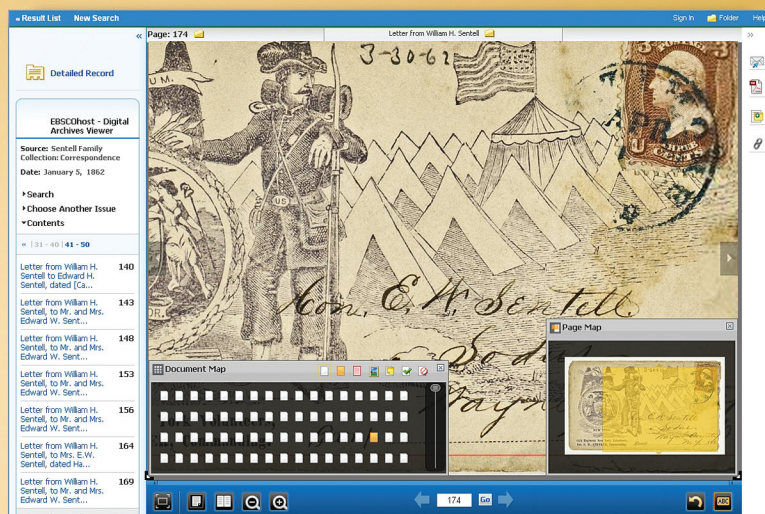

- Search within documents
- Multiple navigation options (through the Table of Contents, turning pages, or via EBSCO's exclusive Page Map feature)
- Ability to limit results by major information sources and document types to quickly hone in on the most desired content source
- Unique *Hover* feature allows users to hover over the Result List to view citation excerpts
- Searched keywords highlighted in text
- Differentiates between direct OCR and "fuzzy" matches
- Easy zoom-in for detailed close-up views of documents, and the ability to rotate page images
- View one or two pages simultaneously
- Unique *Page Note* feature allows users to take notes related to a particular page in the text, save it for future reference, and email it to others
