Location: San Angelo, the center of a West Texas community of more than 100,000 friendly people.

Campus: 268 park-like acres with groves of live oak and palm trees.

Programs: One associate; 42 undergraduate; 25 master's; one doctoral; more than 100 majors and concentrations.

Students: 6,856, from 42 states and 19 countries; student body is 44 percent male, 56 percent female.

Student/Faculty Ratio: 20:1.

Technology: Student/computer ratio is 20:1; wireless coverage throughout campus.

Costs (subject to change): In-state tuition and fees for 15 semester credit hours — \$3,675.

Room and Board: With 21-meals-per-week plan — \$3,982 (estimated semester average).

Books —\$575 (estimated semester average).

Financial Aid: ASU manages a major financial aid program, providing assistance to about 75 percent of our students. With strong gift aid support, including the Carr Scholarship Program, ASU students graduate with one of the nation's lowest average debt burdens.

Athletics: ASU intercollegiate teams compete in NCAA Division II and the Lone Star Conference with five men's teams (baseball, basketball, cross country, football and outdoor track & field) and eight women's teams (basketball, cross country, golf, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball and volleyball).

Recreation: ASU's new \$7 million student recreation center boasts a 10,000-square-foot weight room, a 40-foot rock climbing wall and an indoor jogging track to complement the multipurpose gymnasium, dance studios, racquetball courts and 25-yard indoor pool. Those facilities plus the Intramural Complex provide superb recreational opportunities, either individually or as part of our 175 intramural or club sports teams.

Our Carr Scholarship Program is one of the largest scholarship endowments at a regional university in the United States. During the 2010-11 academic year, ASU students received \$5,452,208 in Carr Scholarships. Since the first Carr Scholarships were awarded in the 1981-82 academic year, Angelo State students have received more than \$61,773,000 in Carr awards.
