

Advanced Art I Semester Project

For your 2nd semester “semester test,” you will be creating a presentation regarding an ARTIST, YOU! You may choose the format for your presentation either powerpoint /keynote or Imovie, or website (wiki, google, etc.).

With either choice you need to include the following for an A:

1.) Information about the artist- YOU:

- Who are you, (at least your name), when were you born
- Something interesting about yourself – or what you like to do
- Add anything else interesting about you. (a few facts of information - total)
- What are some things overall that one could say about the artwork that you have created.
- How might one recognize your work? Or what have you been most know to do within your work.
- Include an image of you, some where within the presentation.

2.) Artwork:

- Include a min of 6 examples art work you have created
- List the title and year of each piece

3.) Creativity:

- Use of transitions
- Use of music or sounds
- Other images or ideas included

4.) Organization:

- Well put together, it all makes sense
- Everything works

5.) Documentation:

- Use a min. of 2 different sources for your presentation. (look for creditable sources, I have given you a few ideas below)
- Document sources you used for information, audio clips, video clips, etc. Either in the last slide or last clip of the move.

- Follow the MLA format. You may use the citation program on Microsoft word or use the link: <http://citationmachine.net>

6.) Presentation:

- Present your information 2-4 minute presentation to the class. (during your semester test time slot)
