Each student has a wiki site, and he or she can access Mrs. Vogt's wiki through the Manteo High School e-board. Set your wiki up as private and protected; you will be taught how to do so during B. Vogt's class instruction. Moreover, there are on-line wikispaces.com tutorials.

Wiki guidelines:

Class Wiki-Basic Outline:

- On the left hand side of the page, are the different pages
- This HOME page is a general introduction, and gives basic information

- The DOCUMENTS page has all the Word documents, and templates, that we use on a regular basis in class
- The UPDATES page has daily notes and updates that you need to know for class.
- On the Updates page is also a DISCUSSION tab on the top of the page. Click on this, and then click on a particular discussion topic. You will need to read the discussion topic and post a response. DO NOT POST on any of the other pages.
- You will also notice that everytime we start a unit a new page appears with that name. On this page you will find helpful sources for the unit as well as all the lessons for the unit. Any assignments, worksheets, etc. for the unit can be found on that page or my e-board to simplify any confusion.
- The WEEKLY ASSIGNMENT page has the file for all the weekly assignment sheets you get in class. This will show you what we are doing all week in class, and help you plan for long term projects:)

Working from home:

If you're working on documents saved to your wiki from home, there are certain steps to take:

1. Open the document from the wiki
2. Save it to your computer at home or your thumb drive
- 3; Once you're finished, re-upload it to your wiki
4. You CANNOT upload documents to the wiki if you still have the document open, so make sure you save and close it before you upload it
