

## The Waimanalo Ahupua'a

Waimanalo is the southernmost of the twelve ahupua'a within the moku of Koolau. Its borders are formed by the Aniani Nui ridge, Mount Olomana and the Kawai ridge to the north, and the Koolau Range to the south. Although historically, the ahupua'a extended all the way to Kouli'ou'ou Ridge to include the bedroom community of Hawai'i Kai and Koko Head, the current land division follows the Koolau ridge to Makapu'u Point. It extends eastward into Waimanalo Bay and includes the islets of Manana (Rabbit Island) and Kaohikaipu. Waimanalo is the only town located north of the Koolau range within the ahupua'a. The majority of the land is zoned agricultural and conservation with the exception of the area covered by Bellows Air Field, a few small pockets of business, and some residential enclaves.
