

Their entire earthly possessions must fit inside a steam trunk in order for them to easily move around, meeting their most crucial areas of service. They are dedicated to a ministry of education to the poor and vulnerable. Mother Pia, who founded the Dominican Sisters Motherhouse, is said to have "embraced all cultures and opened her heart most especially to the needs of the young, the poor and vulnerable. She was a global woman and a risk taker for whom the world itself was the frame of possibility".

We are not alone in our education of young people! The Dominican Sisters are similarly committed to helping prepare our students for a better future. Our retreat day will be a chance for us to learn the stories of the Dominican sisters, have time to enjoy the beautiful spiritual grounds, share together as a community, and help support them. There are 46 rooms that are in need of paint and upkeep. These are small rooms that the sisters use for sleeping or storing their steam trunks, supply rooms, bathrooms, and a library. August 8th is also a very special day for the order, the feast day of their founder, St. Dominic.

The retreat for all faculty and staff will be held at the Dominican Sisters Motherhouse in Fremont on Monday, August 8, 2011. We will be meeting directly at the Dominican Sisters Motherhouse. 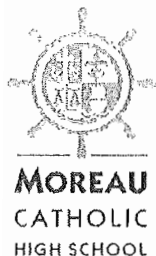

I hope this letter finds you enjoying your summer break. It's amazing how quickly this year is upon us. I had a great summer doing some travelling and spending time reading and working around the house. I am looking forward to working with you on a new and exciting year!

As a faculty, we will continue with our second year focus on grading and assessment practices, along with our colleagues at the other eight high schools in the Diocese. To continue this work, I have asked all of us to read ***A Repair Kit for Grading*** by Ken O'Connor. We will have opportunities within our departments and together as a whole faculty to explore our beliefs around homework and how we can more effectively tie our practices of homework, grading, and assessment more closely to learning outcomes. I distribute these books along with guide questions in May, right before the end of school. Along with the book is a great DVD with the author explaining the context of each "fix". I'm really looking forward to hearing your reactions to Ken's research. There will be an opportunity to discuss the book with our colleagues at our diocesan high schools as well as hear from grade guru Tom Gusky at this year's **Diocesan Secondary Staff Day on September 23 at De La Salle High School**.

As with last year, we will also continue to build our individual curriculum maps through our ***Curriculum Mapper*** software. In addition to continuing with our diary maps, all departments will be working on completing Essential Maps for each course. Cheryl Steeb, we will continue to work with us to focus on these Essential Maps as part of our vertical alignment.

In addition, we gear up for our spring **2012 WASC/WCEA Accreditation visit**. You did a great job in focus groups identifying strengths and areas of growth. We will continue this work in the fall. I'm excited to share the Self-Study document with you based on your focus group work for further feedback.

The **professional development committee** will regroup this year serve as a support team for helping us along this journey of continuous professional reflection and development. I encourage all those who are interested in being part of this committee to contact me immediately via email. It is important that we have a strong professional development committee to help provide feedback about our school wide professional development.

As a reminder, important Office of Instruction documents are located in the Group R Folder on the server. If you look in the **GroupR** folder on your laptop, under **Teachers** you will find a sub folder titled **Office of Instruction**. In that folder you will find (1) the Course Information Guide and (2) Behavioral Policy. As a reminder, please use the Course Information Guide template for all courses you will be teaching. Students and parents expect these on the first day of class. After you have created/revised your CIG for the 2011-12 school year, place a copy for each of your courses in my mailbox no later than Friday, August 12, 2011.

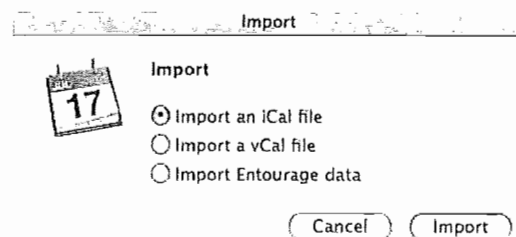
Go to **File – Import** and select **Import an iCal file**. Then click **Import**
