would love to

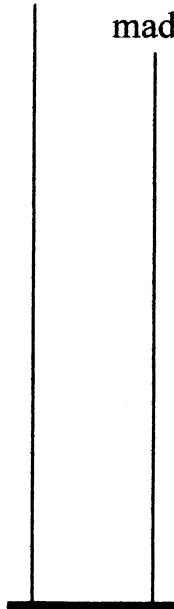

and that is to go outside and find out for your self.



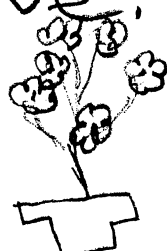
# What Moves me

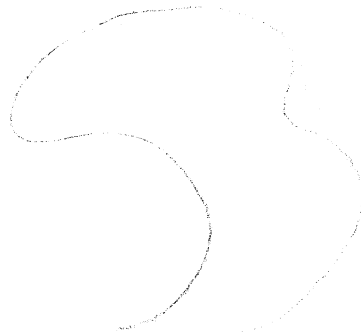
