









Using Your iPad/Tablet for Genealogy

Genealogy Apps – “short list” (e.g., *not* a comprehensive list)

 FamilySearch Family Tree	 Personal Family History Database(s)
	
Universal family tree <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create your account online at FamilySearch.org. • Build/enhance/document your part of the tree online at FamilySearch.org. • Download six generations to view offline. • Navigate/Search the entire Family Tree via WiFi. • Add photos and documents “on the fly” or from camera roll. (<i>Does not</i> crop to document borders.) • Make changes and corrections. 	Your tree <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RootsMagic (or other synched database) • Ancestry.com • Mac Family Tree • My Heritage • Others...

 Evernote	 Scannable
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cloud-based productivity tool. • Capture and organize ideas, information, tasks, documents, images, audio, video... (File size limitations based on account type: free, premium.) • Sync across multiple devices – desktop, laptop, smart phone, tablet. • Tagging – geography, record type, surname, etc. • “Every word” searchable PDFs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Free app by Evernote. • No need to “click” to capture images. • Automatically recognizes boundaries of symmetrical document; crops and captures image. (Does not work well for long, narrow, or irregularly-shaped newspaper articles.) • Easily handles multi-page documents. (Think: book title page for citation + page with ancestor) • Name and save as JPG (to your camera roll) or PDF, send via text or email, and/or Sync to iCloud. • Does <i>not</i> retain the image unless you save it somewhere.
 AnyList	 iBooks
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create and share lists. (Helps counter BSO* distractions.) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep conference syllabi/research reference materials with you, searchable.

Tools in Combination

Purpose	App / Combination of Apps
Connecting clear photos to the FamilySearch Family Tree	Scannable + FamilySearch Family Tree OR Scannable + FamilySearch Memories
Capturing pages from a book or document to use as a Source in Family Tree	Scannable + Evernote + camera roll (+ Family Tree)
Scanning short newspaper clippings	Scannable + Evernote (+ Family Tree)
Sharing heirloom objects as FamilySearch Memories	FamilySearch Memories app

Leverage mobile technology

- Capture images of documents, books, records (instead of taking notes or making paper copies).
- Access information – library catalogue, Family Tree, Ancestry databases, syllabi, maps, ?
- Share discoveries “in the moment”.
- Organize information, make it accessible.
- Don’t get stuck in “cutting board” mentality ...
