



English Collaborative Research Webinar

This webinar starts with the following information from family tradition: A sister died young of tuberculosis. Another sister was a Church of England missionary to Africa. We have the birthdate of Edward O'Brien Mann (whose wife also died young of TB) and he wrote to a sister Ella. The objective is to verify the children and attempt to find out what happened to the children. We have **assumed** children were born every other year to arrive at the following:

Lucius Edward MANN and Charlotte Elizabeth HEATHCOTE were married in 1850 in Ashbourne, Derbyshire, England. Their children are:

- 1) James Cockshutt MANN (born about 1851)
- 2) Henrietta Eliza or Elizabeth MANN (born about 1853)
- 3) Horace Lionel MANN (born about 1855)
- 4) Jessie Charlotte MANN (born about 1857)
- 5) Emily Sophia MANN (born about 1859)
- 6) Lucius Herbert MANN (born about 1861)
- 7) Helen Isabel MANN (born about 1863)
- 8) Charles Heathcote MANN (born about 1865)
- 9) Arthur Fitzgerald MANN (born about 1867)
- 10) Leonard Nevile MANN (born about 1869)
- 11) Edward O'Brien MANN (born 12 Jun 1871)
- 12) Nora Lucy MANN (born about 1873 but supposedly an older sister??)
- 13) Eustace Noel MANN (born about 1875)

Please do **NOT** use family trees from any source (including FamilySearch or Ancestry) as this gives information that we want to try to find during this webinar.

To keep from going too far astray, this exercise will focus on finding information about four of the children, namely:

Henrietta Elizabeth (or Eliza Henrietta)
Horace Lionel
Helen Isabel
Norah Lucy
