The Ísland Map (Icelandic Map) (FHL 949.12 E7i 1974) in the International (INTL) Map Case of the Family History Library (FHL) represents sýsla (county) and hrepp (district) boundaries as of 1974. This map may be represented at a different orientation from those shown on the Icelandic Map (FHL 949.12 E7i 1974).

Though some clerical districts (hreppur) may not be listed in the Family History Catalog (FHLC), they may appear on modern maps and on this included map.

Kirkjuhvammshr.

The spelling on the Icelandic Map in the FHL INTL Map Case (FHL 949.12 E7i 1974) and in *BÆJATAL*, 36 is Kirkjuhvammshr. The FHLC misspells this hrepp as "kirkjhammshr."

Torfastaðahr. / Torfustaðahr.

In Jonasson, *Tracing*, 48, Torfastaðahr. is spelled with ... "fas".... The FHLC splits this hrepp into two geographical areas both spelled with ... "fus"... rather than ... "fas"... namely, Ytri-Torfustaðahr. and Fremri-Torfustaðahr. The Icelandic Map in the FHL INTL Map Case (FHL 949.12 E7i 1974) and *BÆJATAL*, 36, also show the same ... "fus"... spelling and division.
