Some “Memories” you might consider adding:

- Photos of your family.
- Photos of strangers/non-family members in your family photo albums.
- Photos of heirloom objects – then “explain” the object using a Story.
- Photos of a home, farm, barn, car – whatever was significant in your ancestor’s life.
- Audio recording of your own recollections of a grandparent or great-grandparent.
- Audio recordings transferred from old cassette tapes. (mp3 and m4A, up to 15MB)
- PDFs of documents longer than a few paragraphs.
- Digital copies of “scrapbook” items:
 - newspaper clippings: life events, accomplishments, legal notices
 - an individual’s signature
 - cards or letters
 - programs from concerts, sporting events, competitions, graduations
 - certificates
 - achievements in Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, other organizations
