1. Click on **Search**
2. Click on **Record**
3. Research by location - Click on **map of Asia**
4. Click on **China**
5. China indexed Historical records appears - Scroll to bottom for **Chinese Image Only Records**
6. Click on **Chinese Collection of Genealogies, 1239-2014**
7. Click on **Browse through 13.2 million images**
8. Family name list of Chinese surnames appears, invite your guest to find their surname and click on it.
9. Country click **China**
10. Choose the correct province
11. Choose the correct county

China Collection of Genealogies

If unsuccessful thus far, use the FamilySearch Catalog method to find a Chinese genealogy.

1. Click on **Search**
2. Click on **Catalog**
3. Click on **Surnames**,
4. Place your cursor in the **Surname** field.
5. Change the language to Chinese by clicking **EN** in the lower right corner and selecting **CH Chinese (Simplified, PRC)**.
6. Invite your Chinese guest to type their surname. They will know what to do by selecting the correct character for their name.
7. Invite your guest to place the cursor in the **Place** field. Have them type their province
Try to insure that they select the green bar with the appropriate characters in it for the Place field.
8. Click on **Search**. Any number of genealogies may appear.
9. Invite your guests to open those that might be theirs.
10. Show them where the document is located, whether it is in the stacks, a film or has been digitized. If digitized they can open it. There might be a red note indicating that it is in the "Collection of Chinese Genealogies."

If your Chinese guests are Chinese American or speak no Chinese assist them much the same way you would assist anyone else having family in the states. But there are some very helpful sites on Wiki. Among my favorites are:

1. Click on **Search**
2. Click on **Wiki**
3. Click on **Asia**
4. Click on **China**
5. Under **Chinese Research Tools** select **Websites**
6. Click on **House of Chinn** (a most useful site teaching Chinese Americans how to find their records.
7. If guests are from Toishan click on Toishan data base. (a super site to assist guests locate ancestors in Toishan).
8. Go to **Getting Started with China Research**
9. Click on **Chinese Research Helps**
10. Click on **King, Chinese Helps for Jiapu** 家谱 (A most useful paper written by Elder King loaded with Chinese helps coupled with Chinese genealogical record terminology.
11. Click on **King, Chinese Immigration Records** (a most helpful refresher on what can be found and how to prepare for a trip to the National Archives).

If unsuccessful in finding a record online invite your guests to look for their family genealogy in the 10 volume Shanghai Compilation of Chinese Genealogies (中國家譜總目 上海圖書館 INTL 951 D23zz vols 1-10. (The Shanghai Library has the largest collection of Chinese genealogies in the world).

This can be done by:

1. Finding the Compilation in the stacks (**951 D23zz vols. 1-10**)
2. Select Volume #1.
3. Have your guest count the number of strokes in her/her Surname (remind them that they must use traditional characters).
4. In the name index beginning in page 1 find their name.
5. The number provided to the right will tell them where their genealogies are found in the compilation. The genealogies start with those listed as nationwide followed by those listed by province.
