

at Ms Craigi's Office. I paid Rs 8000 the remaining to be paid in a day or two and a copy of the deed to be got. Dr Balachandra gave me the amount.

Wednesda~ :?rd August 1898-Aud~ 20

**In** the morning having heard that Ms Schleicher and others had lost several of their clothes and that they suspected Dr Mathai's servant, his room was searched and the whole of the stolen property recovered. He was at once turned out. **In** the evening called on Ms Narain Rao and told him to get me the remammg sum soon.

Thursda~ +th August 1 898

**In** the morning went to Bellasiar Road to look for lodgings for Mathai. We secured good rooms on the 2nd floor of a house. The first floor was occupied by Govinda a Jain of Cannanore and a native of Nagercoil. Both were employed in Bombay. Together with Narain Rao called at the office of Mr Dikshitsolicitor-and arranged about the document for the money lent by Dr Balachandra.

Frida~ 5th August 1898

**In** the morning went to Bapuji's, but not at home. **In** the evening went to the Fort made some purchases and saw Mr Dikshit about the document to get ready for signing by tomorrow after-noon. I returned home via market. Received a telegram from H.H. Bapuji called at night. Made every arrangement for starting tomorrow by Mail.

5aturda~ 6th August 1 898

**In** the afternoon at 2 went to Mr Dikshit's office and signed the document with Dr Balchandra. Ms Narain Rao promised to pay the remaining sum to Craigi and complete the transaction on Monday. I left Bombay by Mail

train. There were present at the station Ms Jaimohan Das, Bapuji, Ponnaswami, Schleicher, Guan, Shriram Pant, his brother and Damodar.

5unda~ 7th August j 898-Aud~ 2+

At Sholapur a doctor examined my pulse, at night nobody troubled me, though my servants were examined in four different places. Arrived at Shahabad at 11.30 a.m. and was kindly received by Narain Rao Devanathji. **In** the evening visited the stone quarries. There is nothing else worth seeing in this place.

Monda~ 8th August 1 898

Left Shahabad by Mail at [+++] we were examined and again at Raichur and Tungabhadra, at which last station all those who had come
